Pastor's Letter—November 2023

So, here's a bit of truth-telling: before I met any of you, long before you called me to come serve as your pastor, I fell in love with the <u>name</u> of this congregation. From the first time I read the words "Community of Christ," I thought to myself, "Yeah, that's exactly it—it's about being *community* in Christ... and for Christ... and with Christ." It's about doing this life of love, faith, and hope <u>together</u>, because none of us can do it alone.

That's actually a countercultural thing to say or believe in our time and place in history, isn't it? We live in the era of single-serving-size commodities, each with our own personal rectangles of technology and screens to watch whatever we want, regardless of what anybody else in the room wants to watch or read. Making the commitment to doing things together with other people, as community? Well, that can seem strange or out-of-style in a culture of "I-did-it-my-way" thinking. And still, nevertheless, we followers of Jesus keep on being brought back together, with each other, to be—well, exactly what our name says: a community of Christ.

I've been especially reminded of that truth, though, these days. As I write this letter, the memories of your gracious welcome to me, Sarah, Mark, and Anna are fresh in my awareness. And I have been blessed and humbled to receive so much of your kindness, welcome, and help as we have gotten settled into this place and church family. You have reminded me that I don't do my work as pastor alone. We were reminded of that, too, together at my service of installation, when Bishop Beaudoin preached about how we live this Christian life together, sharing The Story, serving one another, carrying Good News beyond our doors to the world around, and both weeping and rejoicing together. And every time I walk into my office, I see the faces of fellow sisters and brothers from across the generations in the small collection of portraits and saints I have put up on the wall, just opposite the door. I've chosen to have those pictures, of folks like Dietrich Bonhoeffer and Dr. King, of Mary the Mother of Our Lord and Fred Rogers, as the first thing I see when I walk into my office, as a way of reminding me, too, that none of us does this life in Christ alone. We are surrounded, as the writer of Hebrews says, by a great cloud of witnesses, and our congregation here in Whitehouse is connected not only to the followers of Jesus in other Lutheran congregations here in Northwest Ohio, but also with God's people of every time and place.

We choose to remember that connection in another way each year in November as well, when we celebrate the Festival of All Saints, too. We remember that God never leaves us isolated and alone to fend for ourselves but gathers us into a people stretching across every time and place, with people of every language, nation, culture, background, and race, and that we remain connected to each other even through the reality of death. We need that reminder, both to give us strength ourselves to keep going through the challenges of daily life, but also to bring to an isolated world the hope of belonging in something bigger than ourselves.

So, join us this November, both on All Saints' Sunday (November 5) and throughout this month, in the ways we are going to practice being exactly what our name calls us to be: a community of Christ. Help us as a congregation to share times of joy and sorrow together, to serve together in our community, and to grow in our discipleship alongside one another. None of us can do it alone—and of course, the Good News we have needed all along is that none of us has ever had to do it alone. We are not just a Collection of Isolated and Distracted Individuals in Christ—we are Community of Christ. Dear sisters and brothers, let us be who we are, this November, and always.

Grace and Gratitude: A Way of Life—Adult Sunday School in November

Sure, we might talk about "thankfulness" on the fourth Thursday in November each year, but it often gets squished in between plates full of turkey, visits to relatives' houses, football games, and too much gravy. Rather than treating gratitude as a once-a-year holiday decoration we have to dust off each November, what if it was a whole way of life for us? In fact, what if our faith as Christians gave us a unique perspective and daily practices that could form us as people of *grace* and *gratitude*? And how might that change the tone of how we face the challenges and changes of life? That's where our conversation will be headed in the Sunday morning Adult Class in the library this November, between the 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. services. Join us for these four sessions for insights and habits that can make a difference in how we live and change our outlook in a culture of consumption and dissatisfaction. Hope to see you this November for a month (and maybe then a lifetime!) of grace and gratitude! A.m.,

New on "Crazy Faith Talk"—The Unspoken God Each Tuesday, our Pastor Steve and two colleagues in ministry offer a weekly podcast called "Crazy Faith Talk," exploring life, faith, the Bible, theology, pop culture, and other bits of church-nerdery, and you're invited to listen along! In their new series, "The Unspoken God," pastors Erica, Sarah, and Steve are exploring those times when we sense God's presence or action in the world beyond our words to express the experience. Over the course of these episodes, the conversation takes us to the experience of "God moments" or "God sightings"—those times when you see or sense God at work in the world, and how recognize God in the midst of ordinary life. We'll also talk about how Christian mystics and contemplatives have used silence and reflection as part of our connecting with God, and how we might do that in our own daily lives. The series will also look at how we discern what God is, and isn't, up to when we don't have a biblical narrator directly telling us what God is doing. In a culture where religious voices (often selfappointed ones, too) point to disasters, earthquakes, hurricanes, and the like as "acts of God" sent as judgment on this or that sin, how do we offer a different perspective that recognizes God's presence in small places, answers to prayer, or acts of kindness? How do we know that the nudges we get to take a certain action or make a certain decision are from God and not just our own baptized self-interest? And how can we get better at recognizing those places where God is at work in the world around us in the everyday? These kinds of questions, along with everyday ideas to recognize God's presence in our lives, are all part of this series, continuing this November here on Crazy Faith Talk! 
