Pastor's Letter—February 2024—"The Cross of Jesus"

On Sunday mornings, when I find myself walking beside our assisting minister and looking up at the beautiful wood and glass of the cross suspended over us in the air at the center of our sanctuary, it hits me again just how astounding it is that a cross, of all things, is the symbol at the heart of our faith. Sometimes I think we forget just how outrageous, how preposterous, a thing it was for those ancient Christians to recognize that the Empire's cruel instrument of death, domination, and torture was in actuality God's upside-down kind of triumph, restoration, and life.

Everybody expects to find the divine up in some distant heaven... or in the peaceful beauty of the starry sky... or the grandeur of sunset over the Grand Canyon. But Christians make the audacious claim that God has met us in the very place a respectable, dignified deity shouldn't be bleeding and dying on a cross between two thieves. That is the glorious scandal of our faith. We've come to recognize God in Jesus, not just at the times when he's performing a miracle, healing the sick, preaching a sermon, or up on a mountaintop dressed in dazzling white, but on a sunless Friday afternoon on a godforsaken lynching tree, most of all. That's why, of all the things that could have been put at the center of our worship space, there hangs a cross—the instrument of torture turned into a sign of hope.

Our older brother in the faith, Martin Luther, once wrote, "The cross alone is our theology." And that's not really an exaggeration. The cross shows us the depth of God's love, the breadth of God's embrace, and the lengths God will go to in order to bring a whole world full of us mess-ups and sinners back to life. If the Gospel were a song, the cross would be the key signature; if our faith were a house, the cross would be the foundation—the starting point on which everything else is built. And in a world like ours that is weary of seemingly unending war and suffering in so many different forms, what we are most aching for is the news that God doesn't stand off, distant and aloof from all the brokenness, but has shared it with us, all the way to death, in order to mend it all. That's why the cross, strange as it might seem, is the center of our faith: it is there, most clearly, that God has come to meet us, to save us, and to bring us to life.

That's why this coming Lent, we are inviting you to share this season of forty days as we meet Jesus *at the cross*. From the Ash Wednesday liturgy, when the cross is traced on our foreheads (reminding us both of our mortality and of God's claim on us through death), through each week until Easter on March 31, we will be exploring the good news of God's love to be found at the cross. We hope you'll be a part of this year's Lenten journey here at Community of Christ, and that through these days, you'll find yourself meeting Jesus more deeply in a whole new way.

"Meeting Jesus" This Lent (Midweek Wednesday Series)

This year, the forty-day season of Lent that points us to the cross of Jesus begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14, which is also Valentine's Day. That might seem a strange overlap—after all, red and pink heart-shaped boxes full of chocolates don't seem to have much in common with a roughly traced cross made of ashes. But maybe this year we can rediscover that the season we observe as Lent each year, really is all about God's love for us in Jesus—love that was willing to share our own mortality and lay down his life for us at the cross! That's the invitation we're making this year as we begin our Lenten journey: to rediscover the depths of God's love... to deepen our connection with Jesus as we follow him... and to recommit ourselves to walking on Jesus' way.

As we have in past years, we'll be offering dinners (hosted and coordinated with the help of some of our youth and other families) on Wednesday evenings in the fellowship hall. On Ash Wednesday, that will start at 5:30 p.m. and will lead into our 7:00 p.m. Ash Wednesday worship service with the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. On the following Wednesdays, we're trying something new to us after each week's dinner: a time that will include song, prayer, and worship, but also hands-on creative projects that will help connect us with some of the central stories of our faith along the way to the cross and resurrection. Our Wednesday series this year will be for all ages, including children and adults, and we hope you'll make the time to join us this year for this special Lenten series.

Catching Up on Crazy Faith Talk Podcast

Pastor Steve does a weekly podcast, "Crazy Faith Talk," with two other colleagues in ministry (one, a Methodist, and one a fellow ELCA pastor) from other parts of the country, and you can listen in on their weekly conversations about topics at the intersection of Christian faith, church life, pop culture, and everyday living. This January and February, they've been doing a series on important books that have shaped our personal faith journeys, and we'll have a new series for Lent starting in the second half of February, too. You can always find links to the latest episode on our church Facebook page, and you can also listen directly at www.blogtalkradio.com/crazyfaithtalk, or you can even ask your smart speaker (like Amazon Echo/Alexa) to play the podcast "Crazy Faith Talk," and catch up that way. It's always free to listen, and it's one more resource to explore and deepen your faith life during the course of your weekly routine!

<u>Bed Builds April 6</u>—Part of our commitment as we give thanks for the past fifty years of our congregation's history is our pledge to take on new social ministries to help reach out to neighbors near and far with God's love. And this project is a really exciting way for us to mark that milestone of five decades! More details are included in this Newsletter!

<u>May 4-5 Weekend</u>—The culmination of our 50th celebration that began back in September 2023, commemorating the first organizational gatherings of what would become Community of Christ will be on the weekend of May 4-5, 2024, when we'll have a big celebration dinner and program, held at Anthony Wayne High School (as an homage to our first gatherings in that cafeteria before our first worship space was built), and then a joyful celebration in worship on Sunday, May 5, with guests and special friends joining us. More details to come on these days as we get closer, but please plan to join us on May 4 and 5 for the climax of our 50-year celebration!



As part of our 50th Anniversary Celebration, we have the awesome opportunity to host a build event and sponsor 50 new beds for those kids in need around our surrounding community. Half of the \$50,000 goal to raise is directed to community projects outside our walls and a portion of that will go to this project.

We are partnering with a local non-profit **Let's Build** that has a mission: *"We believe that every child* deserves a bed of their own to sleep in at night. We believe that every child is full of infinite potential. We help children by providing a bed and empowering them to assemble it and be successful." There is a current waiting list of over 450 kids from ages 3 to 17 years old within approx. 1 hour radius of Waterville. They host events and provide beds, mattresses, and bedding to approx. 100 kids each month. They have "build" events about two times per month, and delivery teams weekly go out to assemble (the kids help) the beds.

We have scheduled Saturday morning April 6th in our church parking lot. We will create a full manufacturing site to turn a few stacks of lumber into wonderful gifts of beds for children. *(we do have a backup indoor location if the weather is bad)*. Everyone is welcome to help during the day of the event working and providing any support. Adults and supervised kids can help operate cutting, sanding, and drilling power hand tools. Anyone is capable and will be taught how to do everything during the event.

The monetary part of the equation is another way to help. Each Bed costs about \$200 to make in materials (our labor is Free (c)). They have networked to great discounts and donations, but still have costs of wood and hardware (~\$100), the mattress (~\$70), and the bedding (~\$30). So, the sponsor of the event has been asked to contribute to the need for the building of the beds, which will be \$10,000. Donations can go to the 50th Anniversary fund that will get split up or to the bed build specifically.

Looking forward to the fun and exciting building and bonding event. Let's pull together our team on our site and work together and give back to those in need. We will have a sign-up sheet closer to the event and need about 50 volunteers to complete the mission. Thanks for your support!

All of these are why we are also inviting the whole congregation to support a special 50th Anniversary Collection of special gifts and offerings that will both position us for the future (and our next fifty years!) and reach out to the world that God loves right now. The other half of all we receive in this special 50th Anniversary campaign will to go relief work near and far through agencies and organizations like Lutheran World Relief or the Bed Build Project.

How can you help support the 50th Anniversary Collection campaign? We've got several ways to be involved: first off, you can simply donate, whether with your regular offering (electronically or in an envelope) by marking that you would like a portion of an offering to go to the 50th Anniversary collection, or with special offering envelopes at the thermometer display in the gathering space. You can simply bring additional donations to the church office on any other day you happen to be stopping by or sending it in the mail. Check out the new 50th Anniversary Campaign thermometer display in the gathering space, too, to see how we are progressing so far, between now and our May 5 Anniversary Weekend!

New Worship Volunteer Role: Verger

There will be a new volunteer role you can help with on Sundays in 2024, with a particular focus on having someone available and "on call" during the service itself for miscellaneous needs, once the service has started. This role, which we are calling the "verger," (a title that goes back centuries for a person set apart as caretaker or attendant during worship services), is meant to help keep eyes and ears open for any needs that might arise during worship. That could be something as simple as watching for people who arrive late to the service and need a bulletin or help with finding seating, or in case any direction is needed for newcomers or visitors with the flow of communion through our aisle. Or it could involve having your eyes open for anyone who might look like they need a first-aid kit, or knowing where the church's AED is in case of a medical emergency. Once worship has started, the people in "up front" roles may not be able to notice or respond to issues that might arise within the congregation or for those arriving once the service has started. And having someone who is willing to keep an eye open for needs that might arise during worship itself prevents a situation where those needs slip through the cracks or small needs grow into larger problems or could help to save time in a situation of an emergent medical need. You'll be able to sign up on our Sign-Up Genius (through the church website, through the Participation in Ministries option under the "Get Involved" tab on our site, <u>www.commofchrist.org</u>). Please consider whether you might have the gifts and interest to serve as one of our vergers on Sundays here at Community of Christ!

The short explanation is that don't prepare anything that has wheat, rye, or barley in it. Prairie Meadow Update



The Prairie Meadow was sowed with 46 species of local Oak Openings phenotype seed on Mon, Jan 22. Sowing native seeds in the winter is necessary because many native species need 60-90 days of cold stratification. Cold stratification basically, means that they require being kept cold and moist to germinate, which in nature occurs on the ground or under a layer of snow. Sowing them overtop of snow helps Sowers readily see where the seed has fallen. The weather on the morning of January 22 was perfect for native seed sowing! We look forward to spring when the native plants will begin to germinate, and we can finally see our prairie meadow starting to grow. Thanks to Toledo Area Metroparks Blue Creek Seed Nursery and other local native plant growers for assisting with the collection of so many varieties of seed for our prairie meadow.
