Pastor's Letter: "Loose In the World"

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

You know, one of the things I love most about the stories we hear following Easter each year is how the risen Jesus never stays put in one place. (As Frederick Buechner once remarked, "Even the nails proved ineffective" at holding God down!) Jesus is always on the move—appearing outside the garden tomb to Mary, showing up behind locked doors where the disciples are huddled in fear, walking along the road to Emmaus and at the table with the broken bread, and at the sea while the distraught disciples go fishing. The risen Jesus doesn't stay put in the tomb, and he doesn't simply hold office hours in a single location, either. And the way the stories go, you almost get the impression that you could meet the living Jesus just about anywhere. Like the lyric from the Peter Mayer song goes, "Hey, hey, this mercy moves—God is loose, oh, God is loose in the world!" That's certainly how it is for the risen Jesus—there's no containing him!

I think that's what excites me, too, about these days at Community of Christ—the living Christ is present and moving through us in all sorts of directions. In just this month ahead, we're building FIFTY beds for kids in our community, finalizing plans for our big fiftieth anniversary celebration weekend (May 4-5), having a family game night, welcoming new members into the congregation, watching the skies for an eclipse, visiting members who are homebound, hosting a concert, offering a workshop through our Northwestern Ohio Synod to learn a new worship resource, and plenty more things along the way, too! God is loose in the world among us, and that's part of how we witness to Jesus' resurrection!

These are definitely signs of life among us, and this is an exciting time to be a part of Community of Christ! After all, when the Easter lilies have lost their bloom and the last of the Easter eggs have been opened and their treats gobbled up, the thing that lasts is the ongoing presence of Jesus, who is alive and keeps us moving. As you read through these pages and see some of the ways you can be a part of what God is up to here at Community of Christ, keep your eyes open for the living Jesus (as we say on Sunday mornings) because he is among us and on the loose!

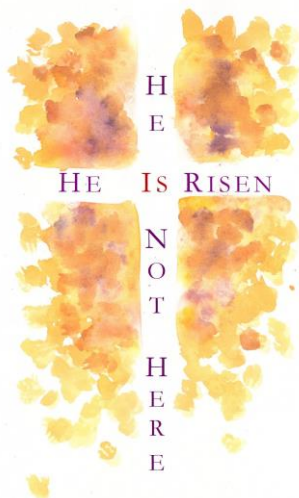

Those pieces finally came together for the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, when those individual parts were revealed in their final forms. Thanks to your creativity and help we made a giant rainbow to remember the end of the Flood story, a mosaic lamb caught in a thicket for the conclusion of the story of Abraham offering Isaac on Mount Moriah, giant waves for the Red Sea crossing, and a depiction of Jesus made from the faces of some of our members. Thanks to all who helped to create these visual elements for the storytelling at the Easter Vigil, and for being willing to be creative this Lent!



Crazy Faith Talk Explores the Sacraments

Pastor Steve's weekly podcast with two colleague pastors, "Crazy Faith Talk," is a mix of conversation about faith, life, the Bible, theology, pop culture, and just about everything else. Earlier this spring, the series for Lent looked at modern-day "temptations" for the church (like the temptation to aspire to worldly power or to peddle prosperity theology), and now this spring we're starting a series exploring the sacraments. What is baptism all about, and how do different Christian traditions think about what happens in baptism? How about Holy Communion—how has the meal of Jesus been understood throughout the last two thousand years of church history, and why do we celebrate it today? **Eclipse Day Gathering at
Community of Christ
(April 8, 2:30-3:30)**

Community of Christ is hosting an Eclipse Watching Gathering this April, and this is a big deal, astronomically speaking! The last time there was a total solar eclipse in northwestern Ohio was more than two hundred years ago in 1806, so this is the chance of a lifetime to see the sun's light being covered by the shadow of the moon. If you're looking for a place to watch, you are welcome to come to the churchyard on Monday, April 8, where from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. we'll be celebrating the day and observing the sky! We can't guarantee what the weather will be like on that day, and if it's cloudy our observations will obviously be limited, but if we get clear skies, this could be a wonder to behold! Since our local schools are off for the day, you won't be missing school, and we'll have some pairs of eclipse-viewing glasses available if you haven't gotten some on your own already (available in stores and online now, if you're interested in getting your own). Since our faith reminds us that God's love is even more faithful than the sun, since "there is no shadow of turning with thee", this is a chance to remember that even when the sun's light is covered up by the moon (or clouds) God's love is constant and ever present—so it makes sense to be with us in the churchyard on a day like this! Join us on April 8 for Eclipse Day at Community of Christ!

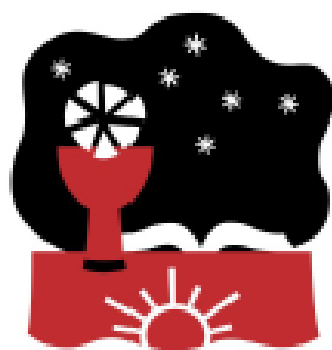

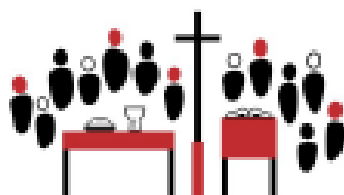

...and anyone excited about the church's song!*



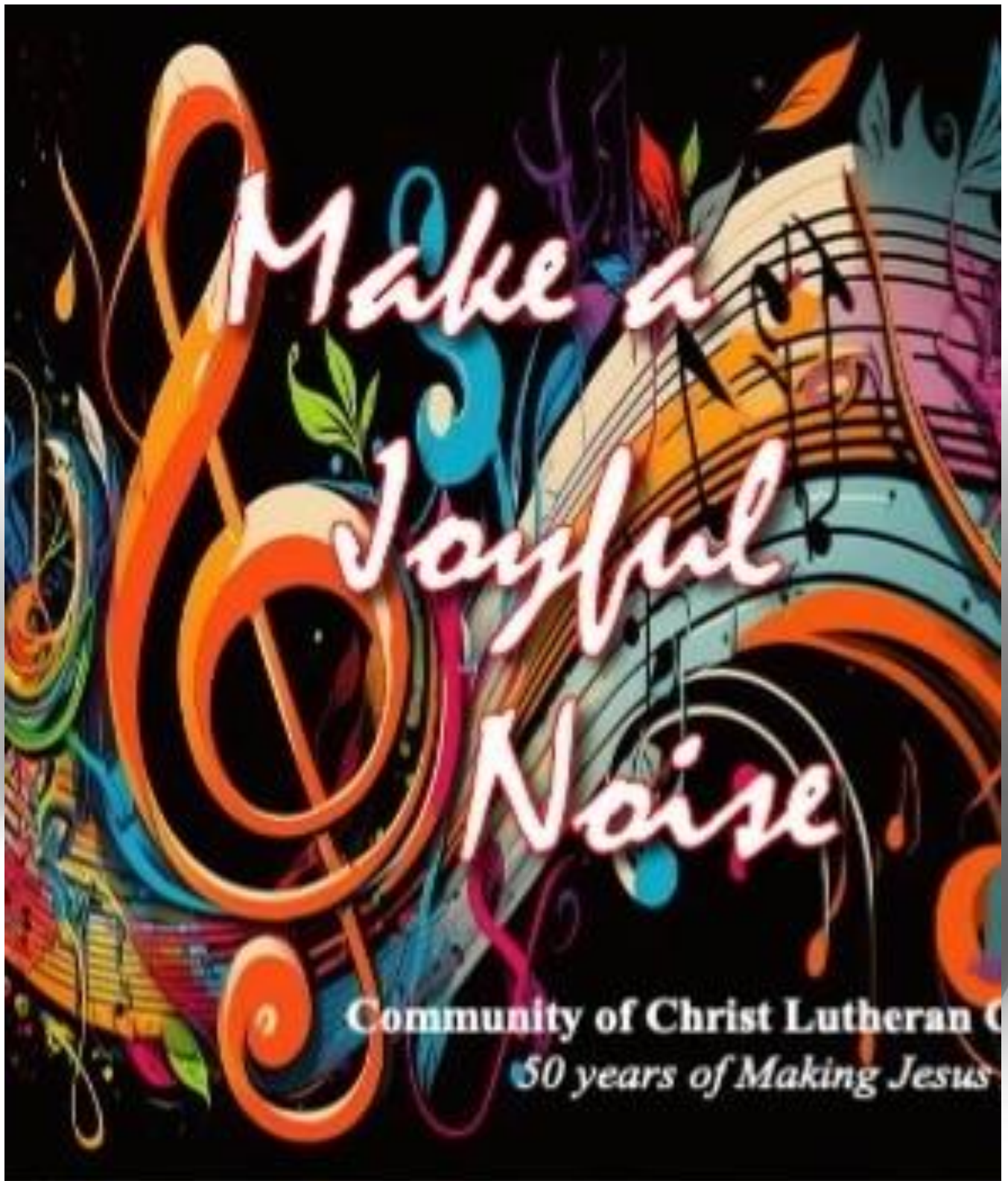

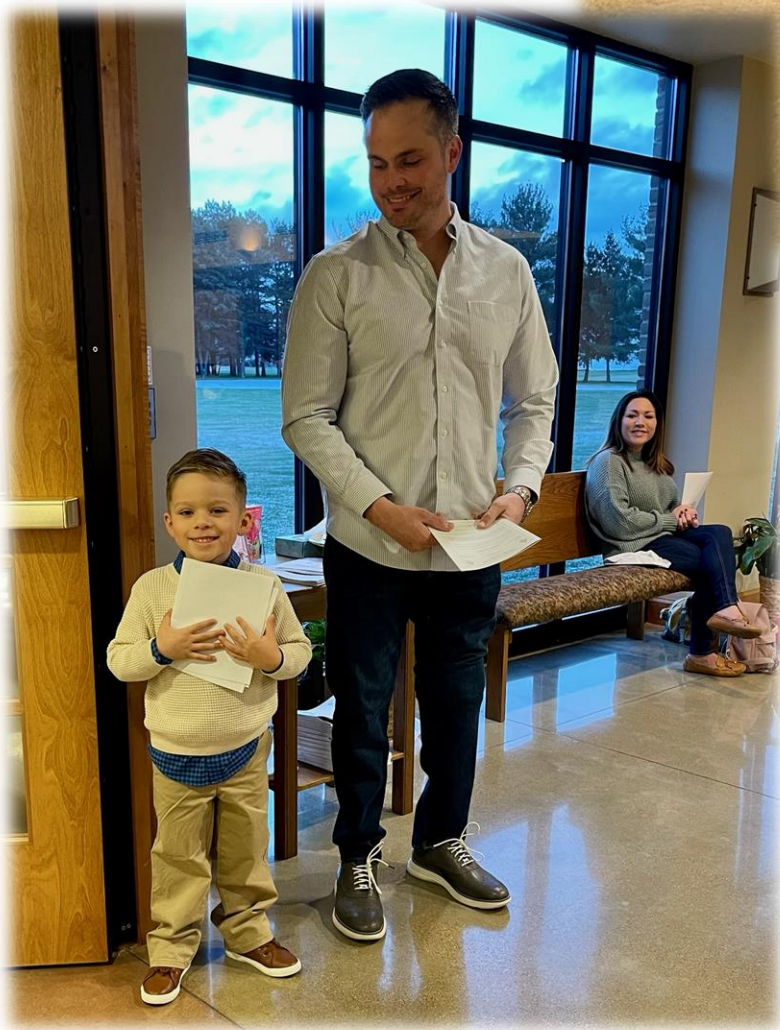
Visitation Ministry Sends Easter and Holy Week Greetings to College Students and Makes Easter Baskets

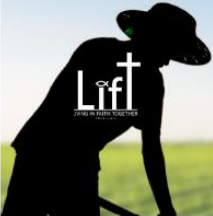

LIFT to Celebrate Easter Vigil on March 30

LIFT will celebrate the Easter Vigil on March 30 at 7 PM at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Fremont. In the early centuries of Christianity, baptisms were only performed at one time a year—Easter Vigil. Persons new to Christianity—catechumens—were baptized at the Easter Vigil and welcomed into the faith. In preparation, the catechumens would have a period of preparation, usually involving prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. This time became Lent. For our LIFT vigil, we'll start outside around the fire, then process inside with candles to hear creative retellings of salvation Bible stories. We'll remember our Baptism and celebrate Holy Communion.



Migrant workers arrive with what they can carry, a backpack or a small bag. They only have enough room for a few clothes and a few personal items. Before they earn their first paychecks, they need some basic items to help them get started. The list contains the following items: laundry baskets, garden gloves (M-L), lightweight blankets, rubber overshoes, pillows, fans, long sleeve thin cotton pullover shirts (S-L), Baseball Caps with neck covering, Small coolers, bandanas, first aid kits, thin lightweight coveralls (S-L), sunscreen, water thermoses, shampoo and conditioner, coffee mugs, laundry detergent, fabric softener, lunch boxes, toilet paper, electric razors, bath towels/face towels/wash clothes, sunglasses, toothpaste/toothbrushes, light raincoats/parkas (S-L), deodorant. As you can see, they need several practical items to allow them to work long days in the fields, seven days a week, in all types of weather!

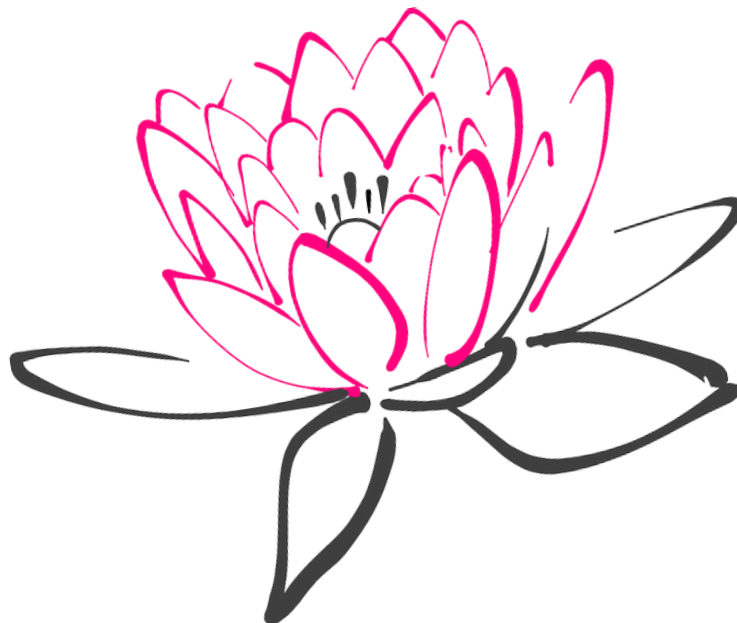

Exciting news from our church! We are offering you more giving options to support our church's financial needs. Council and Finance Committee (as well as the Synod) have recommended the use of a new online safe and secure tool to be able to give online electronically. The program is through Tithe.ly company used by many other churches and organizations. It has several options to be able to give as noted below:

- Your donations are recorded for your giving records, and confidential to the financial secretary.
- When you donate, you designate the fund you would like your monies to go toward e.g., building loan, general, thank-you, or other.

-There are four methods to give:

1. On the church website - @ <https://tithe.ly/give?c=2746426>
2. Online (through tithe.ly website, search for Community of Christ)
3. By text: simply text the word **give** to get started.

- The app and the web link allow you to input credit/debit card information. The text method will charge through your existing cell phone bill.
- There is a fee for this service for the convenience that it offers:
 - You can choose to cover this fee in addition to your donation, OR if you don't, the fee is deducted from the donation to the church.
 - This fee is a percentage typical of this type of service.

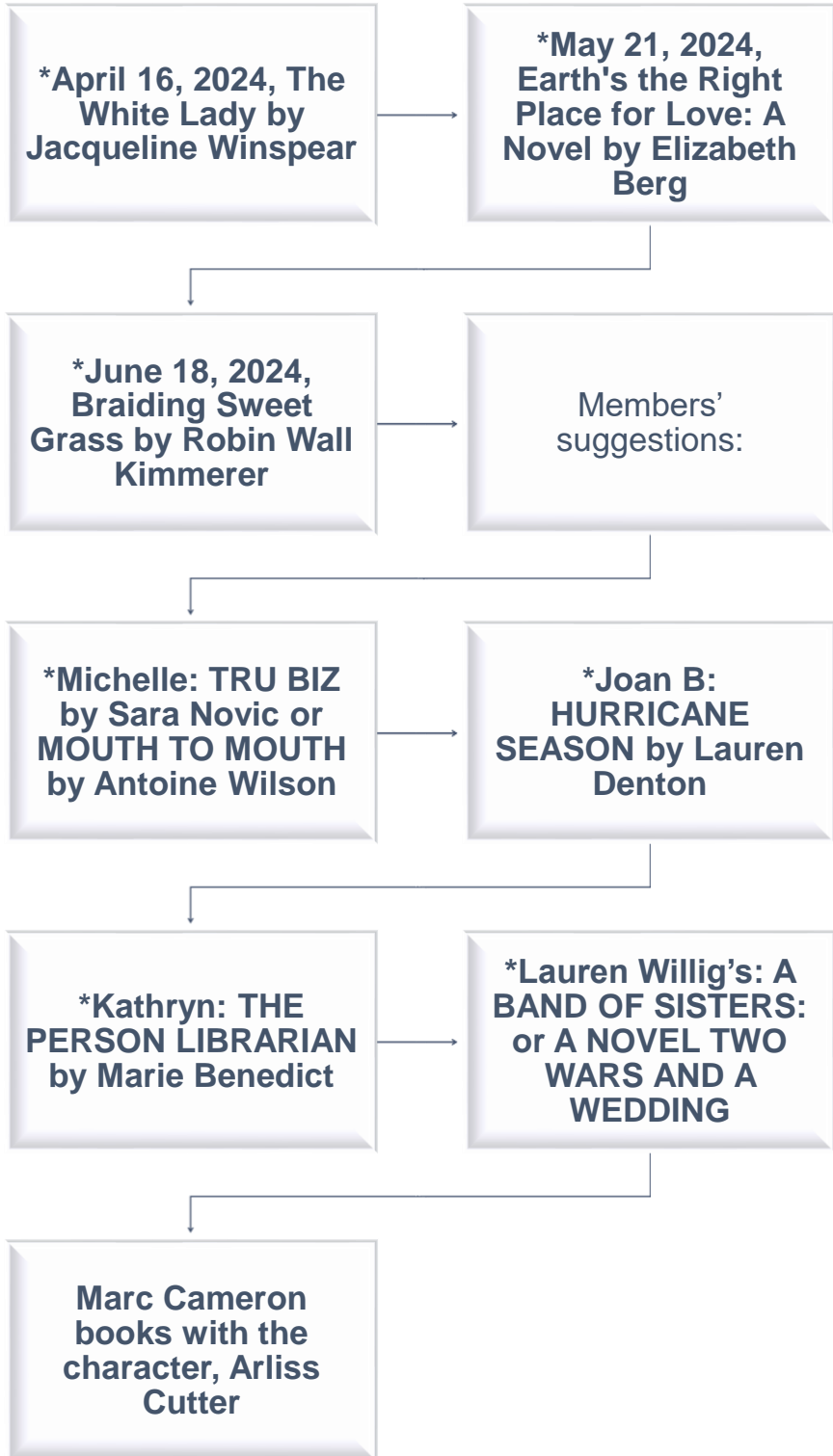
