



## + Confession and Forgiveness

- P In this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other.... In the words of absolution we receive forgiveness as from God. This absolution we need not doubt, but firmly believe that thereby our sins are forgiven before God, for the forgiveness comes to us in the name and by the command of our Lord.
- P Let us make our confession to God. Gracious God,
- have mercy on us. We confess that we have turned from you and given ourselves into the power of sin. We are truly sorry and humbly repent. In your compassion forgive us our sins, known and unknown, things we have done and things we have failed to do. Turn us again to you, and uphold us by your Spirit, so that ...

## we may live and serve you in newness of life through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen

**P** God, who is rich in mercy loved us even when we were dead in sin... that Christ may live in your hearts through faith. **C Amen** 

The congregation may come forward through the center aisle to receive, along with the laying on of hands, individual assurance of forgiveness.

**P** The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **Q** And also with you.

Eternal God, in the sharing of a meal your Son established a new covenant for all people, and in the washing of feet he showed us the dignity of service. Grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these signs of our life in faith may speak again to our hearts, feed our spirits, and refresh our bodies, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen**

  - P It is indeed right our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places... we praise your name and join their unending hymn:




- + Eucharistic Prayer

#### **Distribution of Communion**




