Pastor's Letter—June 2024: The Spirit of Jesus

So, here's a confession: sometimes I think we forget that God is still *doing* things among us, in us, and through us. At least I know I fall into that trap still. We church folks are great at telling stories about what God did thousands of years ago, or what Jesus did in this or that Bible story. Whether it is the flannel board story lessons of your childhood Sunday School memories, the weekly readings in Sunday worship, or famous artworks of scenes from the Scriptures on display at the art museum, we do fine at looking backward. We also do a pretty decent job of talking about God doing things "out there" in the universe, like keeping the planets spinning in their orbits or giving farmers the right amount of rain for their fields and crops. But God... still working through us now? That seems a bit dicey. It seems harder to pin God down in places beyond the printed page of a Bible story, a catechism, or a creed in the hymnal. And yet, that is exactly what the Holy Spirit is up to all the time—working *through* us, in the course of our daily lives and weekly routines, in the present moment.

I've heard it said that Lutheran Christians are great at "First-and-Second-Articleof-the-Creed Christianity." You know, when we profess our faith in the words of the ancient statements of faith called the Creeds on Sunday mornings, we are solid on recognizing God as the One who created the world... and we are fantastic at recounting the story of Jesus, the Son. But when it comes to the third article, "I believe in the Holy Spirit..." we get a little squeamish at moving beyond the scripted story of Pentecost with the trotting out of tongues of fire and sounds of wind like props in a well-rehearsed play. We are a little uncertain about declaring that God's Spirit continues to move among us... that God's Spirit continues to speak to us... or <gasp!> that God's Spirit will continue to lead us in new directions. It's easy to say that Jesus came to give us new insights or change things from the practices of his day and culture, but somehow, we often imagine that everything was set in stone once we got to the end of the Gospels or the last of Paul's letters, as though God's Spirit stopped speaking or God's people are merely a historical-appreciation society like a Civil War Re-Enactment club.

But that's just not how it is. In fact, it's not what Jesus tells us, in the Bible (!), about the ongoing presence of the Spirit. "I have much still to tell you," he says to the fearful disciples on his last night with them, "but you cannot bear it now—so I will send the Spirit who will continue to speak what you need to hear." He even goes further to say that the community of his followers will "do even greater works" than they have seen Jesus himself do! That's a little intimidating! But it also sounds like an adventure, too. And that's the good news of this season for us—we are reminded that the Spirit of God continues to move among us, to speak to us, and to work through us. After having come through the great sweep of the Gospel story from Jesus' cross and resurrection in the seasons of Lent and Eastertide, the story isn't over—it's just that we are now characters and figures in the drama! The Spirit keeps speaking to us, and the Spirit keeps leading us in new directions.

As we move beyond the official celebration of our fiftieth anniversary as a congregation, this is also a moment to remember that our story is not in the rear-view mirror! We have not simply been gathered to talk about what *used to happen* or about where we've *been*, but for God's Spirit to keep moving among us, leading us forward, and sending us out. We are living now the stories that they'll be telling about at the 75th-anniversary celebration! We're daring now the new possibilities that will be the reason someone else is led to faith in Jesus, or someone else is raised up to serve in ministry someday, or someone else finds a welcome after feeling they were unworthy and unloved, or someone receives a meal they would not have had without the work of this congregation. That means remembering that after the First and Second articles of the Creed, there is the daring promise of the Third: We believe in the Holy Spirit, who has not only spoken through the ancient prophets but keeps speaking among us... who not only send out apostles twenty centuries ago but who sends us out to make Jesus known today. In these days, keep your eyes and ears open for the ongoing movement of the Spirit, who meets us right where we are... but who never leaves us where we were.


Crazy Faith Talk Podcast Opens Up the Psalms

This summer, we've just begun a new series explore the book of Psalms in the Bible—how do you read them, why are these ancient prayers and songs in our Bibles, and how can these poems from thousands of years in the past connect with our lives today? We hope you find these conversations insightful, fun, and through-provoking—check it out every week!

Sunday Morning Adult Forum—Returning June 9

After two special events at the end of May and the start of June (our Prairie Meadow dedication and our congregational meeting on June 2), we'll resume offering Adult Forum Sunday School each week, but following our 9:00 a.m. service (so starting at 10:00ish) now that we've shifted to our summer worship schedule with a single 9:00 a.m. service. Since concluding our "Scenes from a Movement" series on the book of Acts in April and May, we'll be starting a new series for conversation and deeper discussion on June 9. Join us for *Word about the Word: How to Read the Bible Wisely and Well*, a series that will introduce some basics for how to engage with the Scriptures, tools for understanding, practices for incorporating Scripture into our daily and weekly discipleship, and guardrails to avoid missing the point or abusing the text. If you've ever attempted to read or study the Bible before and found yourself confused, perplexed, or frustrated—or maybe you didn't even know where to begin—this is a great series to join us for! Come and find us in the library (the long room off the main hallway, opposite the fellowship hall) from about 10:00-11:00 a.m. on Sundays this summer!

Summer Spirituality Saturdays

Here's another new offering this summer at Community of Christ: we're hosting a series of three unique *Summer Spirituality Saturdays*, each hosted here at Community of Christ on a Saturday morning from 9:00-11:00 a.m., and each offering a special topic to connect our devotional life and the world around us in hands-on ways. These are open to people of any age, and you might have one or two that particularly interest you, and others that don't—that's OK. We'll be offering these on third Saturdays over the summer (June 15, July 20, and August 17), and all we'd ask is for you to sign up so we can be ready for the right-sized group. Here are the topics and plans for this summer series:

<u>God at Ground Level: Spirituality of the Prairie Meadow</u>—You might have only seen the church's prairie meadow as a clump of weedy-looking sprouts in the distance of the churchyard, or you might only think of seeing God's beauty in an organized flower garden. But Jesus invites us to understand the Reign of God in the simple and earthy imagery of a sprout coming up from the soil... or the growth of a tiny seed... or the presence of good plants alongside weeds... or the way the sun and rainfall as gifts of grace on the ground. This session is meant to help us explore all of these ideas—and what they can tell us about the Reign of God—in the actual prairie meadow growing up in our own literal backyard! Come on June 15 with clothes you can be in the grass and dirt with (and maybe a folding camp chair if you'd like) for this first event!

<u>Worlds Within Words: Poetry as a Spiritual Practice</u>—There is often a fine line between poets and saints—both have a way of helping us to see the world through new eyes and to be oriented in light of their insights. This session will be an introduction to a variety of poets and poems, a chance to explore how poetry touches our souls in a way that novels or lectures don't and to experiment with our own poetic engagement with the world. This session will be mostly indoors, but with a bit of inspiration from a walk around our little corner of the world that God loves (so comfortable shoes would be good), and we'll have some great resources to share with all who come. This session will be on July 20, again here at Community of Christ!

<u>The Practice of Creativity: Visual Arts and Faith</u>—If we have been made in God's image, and God is a joyful creator who delights in beauty, design, variety, and playfulness, then there will be connections between visual arts and spirituality, too. This session is an invitation for beginners and advanced art students, and everyone in between, to explore how the *act* of being creative puts us in touch with God, regardless of whether your final product goes on a refrigerator with a magnet or gets framed for a gallery. We'll have some hands-on arts activities to try, but we'll also focus on the joy in the act of creating itself, whether you're doodling in marker or pencil, painting with watercolors, or making abstract patterns with color. This event will be great for kids and adults alike, and it will be held in the fellowship hall on August 17.


- The app and the web link allow you to input credit/debit card information. The text method will charge through your existing cell phone bill.
