### July 2024: The People of Jesus

Jesus never shows up alone in our lives, that's for sure.

COMMUNITY OF CHRIST

As one of my favorite faithful cartoons of the late Daniel Erlander asks the question, "Why is it that whenever I ask Jesus to come into my life, he always brings his friends?" And that's just it: there's no authentic version of the Christian faith that just Me-and-Jesus. Following Jesus always brings us to the people of Jesus-not just "the church" but the whole wide, messy fellowship of people Jesus surrounds himself with. They are the misfits and overlooked, the deeply faithful and the deeply doubtful, the old and the young, women and

men, rich and poor, educated and unschooled, and they come from every corner of the world.

As one of my favorite songwriters, Jon Foreman, once put it, "We are a beautiful letdown, painfully uncool-the church of the dropouts, the losers, the sinners, the failures, and the fools." And if you think I'm making it up, just read the stories of Jesus in the gospels and look at the sorts of folks Jesus chooses to surround himself with illiterate fishermen like Peter and Andrew, outcast tax collectors like Matthew and Zacchaeus, traveling women like Mary and Joanna, ex-Zealots like Simon, fiery prophets of the wilderness like John, and bashful religious leaders like Nicodemus. It's a strange and beautiful mix of humanity-but then again, that's Jesus for you: he loves the whole messy mix of us.

That's why this July, our focus in our year of "Meeting Jesus" is on the people of Jesus. You'll hear stories of these people as Jesus gathers them, loves them, helps them, and sends them to worship on Sundays. We'll explore more of these fascinating faces in daily devotions throughout July, too. And I would invite you to see our gatherings throughout the summer as chances to be among the people of Jesus. Whether we're singing beside one another in worship, learning together in a Bible study or Sunday School class or other special workshops, getting ready for a late-summer campout weekend, or working side by side making meals or tending a community garden at Urban Wholistics, we will have some really great opportunities to be immersed in the people of Jesus-or, as we also call ourselves, the community of Christ.

Whatever else it means to be a follower of Jesus, it certainly means getting to know the people Jesus brings along with him. Get to know a new face this summer; learn someone's story at a gathering like Food for Thought. Be the face of welcome for someone who is waiting to hear that there is a place for them here among God's people. After all, whenever Jesus comes into our lives, he always brings his friends.

### Crazy Faith Talk Podcast Looks at Church-State Relationship

Our Pastor Steve continues to offer a weekly podcast with two colleagues in ministry that looks at a variety of topics, subjects, and ideas from faith and church life to pop culture and everything in between. "Crazy Faith Talk" releases new episodes every Tuesday at noon, and you can listen for free, either finding the link on our Facebook page, or finding it at <u>www.blogtalkradio.com/crazyfaithtalk</u> (where you can also subscribe for free to get notifications of new episodes), or even asking your Smart Speaker (like Amazon Echo) to play the podcast "Crazy Faith Talk." This July, we'll be starting a new series that looks at the relationship between church and state, and why it's actually a really good thing, *from a Christian perspective*, for those two not to be confused, merged, or blurred into one thing. Our older brother in the faith, Martin Luther, famously wrote an important treatise on the separation and distinction between church and state five hundred years ago, and of course still today Christians wrestle with how our faith affects our individual choices as well as our life together in a society that includes people of many different faiths, or no faith tradition at all. So, if this conversation seems like something you would like to learn more about, check out our weekly episodes of "Crazy Faith Talk" starting this July!

### Sunday Morning Adult Forum in July

Our Adult Forum Sunday School Class has been digging into some basics for being better readers of the Bible this June, in our series, "Words about the Word: How to Read the Bible Wisely and Well." Over the course of this series, we've looked at important ideas like reading in *context*, understanding *genre*, the difference between *literal* and *figurative* language, and understanding the difference between *translations* of the Bible—as well as the work that goes into translation. All of those can offer some basic helpful guidelines for being responsible readers of Scripture. Now, as we head into July, we'll have a short spin-off series in two parts, that will give us an overview of the Old and New Testaments. Join us on July 14 for an introduction to the Hebrew Bible (what we sometimes also call the Old Testament) and then on July 21 for an overview of the New Testament writings as well. Everybody is welcome to join us as you are able and as your schedule and interest allows—find us in the Library on Sunday mornings around 10:15 a.m.!

### Summer Spirituality Saturdays

Continuing this July we're hosting a series of *Summer Spirituality Saturdays*, each hosted here at Community of Christ on a Saturday morning from 9:00-11:00 a.m., and each offering a special topic to connect our devotional life and the world around us in hands-on ways. These are open to people of any age, and you might have one or two that particularly interest you, and others that don't—that's OK. We'll be offering these on **third Saturdays** over the summer (July 20 and August 17), and all we'd ask is for you to sign up so we can be ready for the right-sized group. After our first session in June on the spirituality of the prairie meadow, here are the topics and plans for the rest of this summer series:

<u>Worlds Within Words: Poetry as a Spiritual Practice</u>—There is often a fine line between poets and saints—both have a way of helping us to see the world through new eyes and to be oriented in light of their insights. This session will be an introduction to a variety of poets and poems, a chance to explore how poetry touches our souls in a way that novels or lectures don't, and to experiment with our own poetic engagement with the world. This session will be mostly indoors, but with a bit of inspiration from a walk around our little corner of the world that God loves (so comfortable shoes would be good), and we'll have some great resources to share with all who come. This session will be on **July 20**, again here at Community of Christ!

<u>The Practice of Creativity: Visual Arts and Faith</u>—If we have been made in God's image, and God is a joyful creator who delights in beauty, design, variety, and playfulness, then there will be connections between visual arts and spirituality, too. This session is an invitation for beginners and advanced art students, and everyone in between, to explore how the *act* of being creative puts us in touch with God, regardless of whether your final product goes on a refrigerator with a magnet or gets framed for a gallery. We'll have some hands-on art activities to try, but we'll also focus on the joy in the act of creating itself, whether you're doodling in marker or pencil, painting with watercolors, or making abstract patterns with color. This event will be great for kids and adults alike, and it will be held in the fellowship hall on **August 17**.

### Community of Christ Votes to Host a Seminary Intern!

At our June 2 congregational meeting, the gathered voices of Community of Christ voted to say YES to the request from the Northwestern Ohio Synod to be a host for a seminary intern in need of a local placement starting this fall, and we are beginning preparations for that intern to begin this September! Seminarian Natalie Downs will be our intern (also sometimes called a <u>vicar</u>) for eighteen months in a part-time capacity, and we're excited to have her as a part of our Community of Christ church family! Some may have had the chance to meet Natalie at our first *Food (and Drink) for Thought* event in June, but we'll look forward to hearing more from her in various ways later on this August and having the chance for her to introduce herself to the whole congregation once she begins in the fall as well. Meanwhile, our council is moving forward with creating an Internship Committee, selecting a group of members from across the congregation who can be a sounding board for the intern separate from the pastor, as well as to help her to become acclimated here at Community of Christ. We're thankful for our Pam Davis who has agreed to serve as our chairperson for the Internship Committee! Stay tuned for more exciting details!

**The Property Committee** would like you to be aware after 50 years of service that our air conditioning unit for the Fellowship Hall needs replacement.

This unit was initially our heat pump for the original worship space. When natural gas became available in the area it was converted to work as an air conditioner for the building. It has kept us comfortable for many years. However, the compressor has failed, and the entire unit needs to be replaced due to age.

We are currently seeking an acceptable proposal from 3 HVAC contractors. The church council authorized the use of our available capital improvement funds at its June meeting. However, we are looking at bids ranging up to \$16,000.00 for the work.

We would appreciate the consideration of your offerings to the Capital Improvement Fund to replenish this expenditure.

### CoC Prairie Meadow Dedication









On Sunday, May 26, the people of God at Community of Christ Lutheran Church in Whitehouse dedicated their new prairie meadow. Gathered around the corner of their property planted with native plants beloved by pollinators, Marilyn Dufour from the Sacred Grounds project of the National Wildlife Federation recognized Community of Christ as a Sacred Grounds certified community! Laurie Mauro and other members of Community of Christ have worked closely with other congregations and knowledgeable folks in the community to pursue Sacred Grounds status. This certification entails that the congregation is at work to:

- Show connections between faith and the environment

- Educate members of their faith community on ecological matters

-Reach beyond their faith community, into the community at large, encouraging all to participate in these best practices

Community of Christ is just one of over 30 diverse faith communities across the region who are working towards or have achieved Sacred Grounds certification. Other participating NWOS Lutheran congregations include Hope Lutheran, Ottawa Hills, Toledo Campus Ministry at the University of Toledo, Salem Lutheran, North Toledo, St. Stephen, Sylvania, Holy Trinity, Toledo, Faith Lutheran, Swanton and Olivet, Sylvania.



### Prairie Meadow Update



Spring and summer have arrived bringing immense activity in the Prairie Meadow. Thanks to God's gracious gift of rain an extravaganza of plants have begun to grow in the prairie meadow! This includes not only the seeds that were sown in winter but those lying dormant in the seed bank for many years, many of which are non-native invasive species. This is all normal for a first-year prairie. Some of the non-native annual species may prevent our native seeds from growing optimally, so the typical challenge in a prairie during its first two years is to keep the non-native annuals down to allow the native species to grow. The major non-natives in our meadow are common knotgrass (polygonum aviculare) and Speedwell (Veronica). Several thistle species have also found the prairie meadow to be a conducive home. Toledo Metroparks is providing us with guidance on which species to remove and or mow to ensure that our native species have a good opportunity to establish themselves. The primary management in the first year is mowing at heights appropriate to allow the natives to grow yet take down the non-native before they go to seed. This means that we will have less opportunity to see our newly sown plants bloom this year but is necessary to allow them to develop deep root systems to be healthy in subsequent years and outcompete the non-native annuals. Please stop by the Prairie Meadow and enjoy the activity and buzzing about God's creation!



Polygonum aviculare or common knotgrass is a plant related to buckwheat and dock. It is also called prostrate knotweed, birdweed, pigweed, and lowgrass. It is an annual found in fields and wasteland, with white flowers from June to October.



Veronica is the largest genus in the flowering plant family Plantaginaceae, with about 500 species. It was formerly classified in the family Scrophulariaceae. Common names include speedwell, bird's eye, and gypsyweed.

Sacred Grounds  $_{TM}$  is a Garden for Wildlife program of the National Wildlife Federation which encourages faith communities to create wildlife habitats on their properties and educate themselves and their communities about the ecological good that landscaping with native plants can provide.


