The Table of Jesus

The night before a wedding, the bridal party often gathers with family and friends for a rehearsal dinner. After they've had a walk-through of how the ceremony will go, and before the busy-ness of the wedding day itself, they get a chance to sit around at a table, to laugh and tell stories, to enjoy being with one another, and to share a good meal. And they all know that even then, the best is yet to come. The rehearsal dinner helps get everyone in the bridal party ready for the FULL celebration the next day, when even more people will be gathered to witness their vows, to pray God's blessing on the marriage, and probably to do the Funky Chicken or the Electric Slide at the wedding reception before cake is served. I think that's what I like the most about the tradition of a rehearsal dinner: it is a celebration with an even bigger table yet to come.

And if you have ever found yourself smiling and raising a glass at a rehearsal dinner for a wedding, then you already have a glimpse of what is really happening every Sunday when we gather in worship around the Table of Jesus. For all of our joyous music, all the splendor of liturgy, all the hoopla of banners and processions and candles, and all of the breaking of bread and sharing of cups, we are here on Sunday mornings for a weekly rehearsal dinner—getting us ready for the resurrection banquet at God's table, where the party never ends, and there are places set enough for everyone. We come to share, as the old line of the liturgy goes, "a foretaste of the feast to come," every time we break the bread and drink the cup of Jesus. And much like happens between a rehearsal dinner and a wedding ceremony and reception, our Sunday gathering gets us ready for an even bigger celebration with even more people. That's how the Table of Jesus works.

As we continue this year's focus in our worship and devotional life on *Meeting Jesus*, this August, we'll focus on what it means to be welcomed to **the table of Jesus**. Because over and over again in the gospels, we find Jesus welcoming people to share a meal, to break bread, and to celebrate with him. He's at dinner parties with those outcast "tax collectors and sinners," letting them know that they are welcome at God's table. He's feeding thousands on a hillside by the lake with just a few loaves of bread and two measly fish, then offering himself to them as "the bread of life." He's breaking the loaf on the night of his betrayal and laying down his life for his friends. And all of it points to the way God promises to throw a feast for "all peoples" one day where tears are wiped away, the best food is shared, and death is destroyed forever (see Isaiah 25:6-9).

Every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, or Holy Communion, at the Table of Jesus, we are not only remembering those past meals Jesus shared and the past event of the cross and resurrection, but we are having a rehearsal dinner for the big celebration at which all peoples will find a welcome. We practice welcome and hospitality here as a church family to get us ready for the even

grander welcome Jesus will make for all creation. We make a place for the outcast and the stranger because we know that's who Jesus kept opening his tables to—and because he did the same for us, too.

I want to ask you this August, as we gather around the Table of Jesus in worship, as well as around the campfire during our campout weekend, or any of the other meals we share together, to see our Sunday celebrations as a rehearsal dinner for the Reign of God: a chance to celebrate now, because of the even grander celebration yet to come, where all will find a place, and where there is abundance enough to share.

Looking forward to sharing those tables with you all in these days, Pastor Steve

Sunday Morning Adult Forum In August Explores Women's Leadership in the New Testament

Learn some of the lesser-known hidden figures and unsung heroes from the time of the first generation of disciples and into the early church and get to know some of their rarely-told stories. 


August Spirituality Saturday: Visual Arts and Faith

Session 2: 9.25-10.27

We will rehearse for 5 Wednesdays and will sing on Sunday, 10.13 and 10.25, (Reformation Sunday). We will also record a song for an Advent/Christmas recording the church will be producing.

Session 3: 10.30-11.24 We will rehearse for 4 Wednesdays and sing on Sunday, 11.24, (Christ the King Sunday.)

Session 4: 12.4-12:24

We will rehearse the 3 Wednesdays in December from 7:45-8:45 after the Advent service and sing on Sunday 12.8, Sunday 12.22, and at the 11:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service

2. If you do not currently have online directory access and would like access, please request it by completing the hardcopy survey or asking a Stewardship Committee member to enter your request for you.

Once you have access to the online Church Directory, you may update your own family photo by using a photo taken at church. Many of our currently posted directory photos are very out of date. 


