Pastor's Letter The Love of Jesus



We had a really good conversation at our first Confirmation Class earlier this fall. In our opening session with students from both Community of Christ and neighbors at Zion (Waterville), we posed the question to our sixth and seventh-graders, "What does it mean to be a Christian?" and invited their responses. Almost immediately, someone (who had clearly been paying attention to something they heard in church, somewhere along the way) said, "We're disciples of Jesus!" Fantastic—that's a great place to start!

But that begged a follow-up question since the word "disciple" can be a bit of churchy jargon for some ears. So, I followed up: "All right—what does it mean to be a *disciple*?" And after the room had a bit to mull that question over, someone offered a thought, "Someone who learns from Jesus… to do the things Jesus taught us to do… to live like Jesus." Again, that's a great insight—we aren't just people who know <u>facts</u> about God like we had to memorize state capitals or the periodic table in school at some point, but we are people learning a way of life. We were making good progress in this discussion.

Then came the real challenge—the \$50,000 Question, so to speak: **What does Jesus teach us to do, after all?** In other words, *What kind of life is Jesus calling us to be disciples in? What is Jesus' way of life all about?* And once again, the class thought about it for a moment and then offered this answer: **love**.

The heart of the way of Jesus, which is thus also the heart of our lives as disciples, is learning the love of Jesus. That's more than just an emotional gutresponse thing: love is always more than just a "feeling" but about the choice to do good to others, to seek their well-being, and to put the needs of others even above and before our own self-interest. Love involves our priorities, our choices, our temperament, our words, and our actions... and, sure, yes, also our emotions as well. And as we learn from Jesus—hearing his teachings, reflecting on the stories of his actions, and seeing his way of life reflected in other disciples' lives, too—we come to see a love that reaches out not just to friends or "in-group" members, but to strangers, outsiders, and even enemies. We see a love that goes beyond good intentions and mere talk, to actions. We see a love that is courageous and takes risks and bears the ridicule of others, including the Respectable Religious Leaders ("Who does this guy think he is, eating with THOSE people, those tax collectors and sinners?"). We see a love that is willing to take time with people ("He had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd..."). And we see a love that is willing to serve in lowly positions rather than staying comfortable. All of that is what the love of Jesus looks like, and honestly, it takes a lifetime to learn it—to let it sink into our bones and become our own way of life. That's why we keep gathering together—in worship, in study, in service, around tables and meals—so that together the living Jesus can keep teaching us to embody his kind of love for all.

And we'll be exploring it beyond mere sentimentality, to dive deeper into how we love God and love others the way Jesus embodied for us. It will involve our whole selves, including our time, our talent, and our treasure. And it will begin with being re-centered in the assurance that before we love anybody else, Jesus has loved us first. That's where we begin, every day. That always moves us beyond mere intellect or feelings to the actions, practices, and choices we make in our lives, and how they all center on Jesus' way of life—both what Jesus modeled in his own actions and what he described in his stories and teachings. "Held In Trust"—Sunday Morning Adult Forum Continues this October

This October, our Adult Sunday School class continues our study called, "Held in Trust," intended to help us see our whole lives in response to God's goodness. A New Journey within a Larger Journey

A little over a year ago, my family moved from Dexter, MI to Temperance. One of the things you notice after living in a house for twelve years with two kids is how much stuff you accumulate over time. Even though cleaning out things and moving is quite a daunting task, one of the joys of sorting through items is finding things from your past that you had forgotten about. Pictures, cards from birthdays, baby blankets, certificates, for example. My parents also have recently been going through their things, getting ready to give me the last of my childhood items. My mom sent me a picture via text of something she wrote in my baby book about my baptism on Sept. 15th, 1985, that struck me. It stated, "On Sept. 15th, you were baptized. You wore the exact same christening dress I did. Also, we were baptized in the same church (St. James Lutheran - Toledo, OH). When you were baptized you looked right in the pastor's eyes as if you knew exactly what he was saying. Who knows? Maybe you did."

My mom sent that picture to me a little after I started my internship, and in some way, I feel that it was the Holy Spirit's way of comforting my nerves. I wasn't expecting to be nervous at the start of my internship, but I was, and some fear started to set in those first few days. It reminded me that in those baptismal waters, I was claimed as a child of God, welcomed, forgiven, and given eternal grace to freely go and serve in the name of Jesus. As I sat in worship at Community of Christ on September 15th, I was reflecting on the idea that 39 years ago, little did I know as an infant or anyone in my family know where this baptism journey would lead me. And all those pictures, cards, things that I had stumbled upon reminded me of who I was and the people who made an impact on my life to get me to this point. God has accompanied me to this point, and God will continue to accompany me wherever I am called.

For all of us, our lives can lead us through hills and valleys, death and life, beginnings and endsthese experiences through the power of the Spirit shape and form us into the people we are today. Whatever your journey entails- the good, the bad, and the ugly- know that God has been and is accompanying you on this journey. God is not an arrival point we work towards, measured by how good and great we are at following Jesus. God is the companion on your journey, shaping and molding you by water, word, bread, and wine. God's grace goes with you because of what Christ has done for you. And so, throughout our baptismal journey, we are blessed because no matter what lies ahead in the unknown, we trust that God walks in it and through it with us. Thanks be to God.








Grow in Faith Together

Council and Finance Committee (as well as the Synod) have recommended the use of a new online safe and secure tool to be able to give online electronically. The program is through Tithe.ly company used by many other churches and organizations. It has several options to be able to give as noted below:

- Your donations are recorded for your giving records, and confidential to the financial secretary.
- When you donate, you designate the fund you would like your monies to go toward e.g., building loan, general, thank-you, or other.
- -There are four methods to give:

- 2. Online (through tithe.ly website, search for Community of Christ)

- There is a fee for this service for the convenience that it offers:
 - You can choose to cover this fee in addition to your donation, OR if you don't, the fee is deducted from the donation to the church.
 - This fee is a percentage typical of this type of service.
