

The Holy Gospel: John 20:19-31

¹⁹ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written so that you may come to believe that

Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Nicene Creed






The Words of Institution

New Thursday Bible Study Series: Join us for our Thursday Afternoon Bible Study, The Book of Judges, with a look at the Old Testament book we call "Judges." This interesting book explores the time in Israel's history between the settling down in the land after the wilderness wanderings and the rise of kings like Saul and David, and it offers a window into what happens in a community when everyone is left to their own devices. The book of Judges also reminds us of God's patient, enduring love even in the face of our persistent sin, so there is a word of hope and grace even through the worst periods of history, too! If this sounds like something you would like to learn more about, join us in the Council Room (where the Thursday Bible Study usually meets) at 1:00 p.m. to dig into the Word together!

Adult Forum this April: Imaging the Word Join us for our Sunday morning Adult Forum, *Imaging the Word: Symbols, Icons, and Art Connecting with Faith* from about 9:00 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. We'll explore some of the central symbols of the Christian faith, what they signify, where they come from, and how they have been used over the course of the last 2,000 years. We'll also explore how traditions like the Eastern Orthodox churches make use of a particular stylized form of artistic depictions of biblical figures and stories in *icons*, and how to understand the way they use imagery to convey meaning. And we'll also stick our toes in the world of art history and see how artists, sculptors, and painters have used visual media to connect to our faith, both in some familiar ways and some surprising ways.

Visitation Ministry Hosts End-of-Life Questions Workshop—May 3 at 9:00 a.m. It can be scary or anxious to have conversations about death and dying, especially when we are talking with loved ones or think about details like our wishes for arrangements, choices for funerals, or even questions about organ donation, cremation, and traditional burial. But as the good Mister Rogers used to say, "When something is mentionable, it becomes manageable." In other words, when we create a time and space to talk, even difficult subjects can become easier to engage with, especially when we know we are not alone. That's why the Visitation Ministry is hosting a workshop open to all on the morning of Saturday, May 3, to explore questions and topics related to the end of life, including planning for funerals, frequently asked questions, and how we address this subject with family members. Join us at

Community of Christ from 9:00-11:30 a.m. for a chance to learn, discuss, and bring your questions. We'll also be able to share details about our usual practices for funeral services and meals here at Community of Christ, and we'll offer a chance for any who want to think through their own wishes for service details to do so. Maybe this is a subject you've been putting off thinking about, or maybe you've just needed a reason to finally sit down with loved ones and talk through your wishes. But we hope that this workshop can be helpful for you, and we'd invite you to join us on May 3 to find out more. You can sign up at the kiosk in the Gathering Space.

Youth Pool Project

The Outreach Committee, together with Social Action Ministry, is partnering with Genacross Family and Youth Services to provide pool supplies to the youth center located in Liberty Center. Family and Youth Services works with children and youth ages 6-17 by providing programs that offer a structured daily routine, including teaching social skills, coping skills, and independent living skills. Their goal is to create behavioral changes in children and youth that enable them to function productively and appropriately within their communities. They currently serve 30 children and youth at the Liberty Center location.
