Pastor's Letter, June 2025 - The Edge of Discipleship

Maybe you've heard the old saying that being in worship on Sunday morning isn't like watching your favorite football team play a game while you're seated in the stands or at home—it's like being in the huddle on the field so you'll know where to go and what to do when the ball is snapped. In other words, we aren't here to be spectators who watch from the bleachers or an audience taking in a performance on stage; we are on the team, and we're the ones running with the ball. And that also means that Sunday mornings aren't the only way—or even the main way—that we live out our lives of faith, not any more than the huddle is the point of a football game.

No, just like the huddle of the players is the chance they all get to be directed for where to go and how to move in the next play on the field, we gather in worship on Sundays to be re-centered, re-oriented, and re-commissioned for living and serving, and witnessing in the week ahead. It's the huddle that reminds us who and Whose we are, so that in our Monday through Saturday lives, we can be reflections of the way of Jesus in our words, actions, and choices.

This summer, our focus in this year of *Living on the Edge: Christianity Beyond Our Comfort Zones* is going to be on just that: how we move from seeing ourselves as passive observers or an audience for a performance to understanding ourselves as *disciples* of Jesus who carry out his commissioning and embody his way of life and love for the world. You'll see it happening starting on June 1, as five of our young people say "Yes!" back to the God who first said "YES!" to them at their baptism, when they are confirmed in the faith. And as you hear each of them respond to the questions about continuing on in their lives of faith, serving all people, and working for justice and peace in the world, by saying, "I will, and I ask God to help and guide me," I would invite you to hear those questions being addressed to you, too. Will you and I also continue in our lives of faith, not merely watching a performance or standing at a distance, but living out our faith as a part of our daily lives? That's where Jesus is leading us.

You'll feel the same pull to discipleship when you see the t-shirts that Outreach Committee is having made (see the article in this issue), which will be both a way of sharing our faith with our clothing and supporting the good work of Neighborhood Bridges, which connects people with needs to people with resources in our community. The shirts say, "Be the evidence of God's love," and in a sense, that's what the whole Christian life is about. We don't do good in the world in order to try and impress God or win favor from our neighbors, but rather our lives can be the evidence for other people to see that God does love them, and that the Good News of Jesus is real. Finding ways to do that—to be the evidence of God's love in the world—that's what it means to be disciples. That's what it means to get out of the bleachers and onto the field.

And when we see our whole lives as disciples, then we'll understand the whole point of Sunday mornings: it's never been about being entertained or amused. It's always been about being re-centered in the Story of God, re-grounded in the promises of God, and renewed at the Table of God, so that we can live as the feet and hands of Jesus on the playing field of our everyday lives. Join us this June to be a part of the action... on the edge of discipleship.

From Vicar Natalie Bowns

One Sunday morning at my previous church in Ann Arbor, the senior pastor, Jim, was late to worship. It was really unlike him not to be around right before worship, or to walk in at the last minute. No one knew where he was as the time was coming close to worship. Right before worship started, he rushed in with naan bread for communion in his hand. He shared during his sermon that he realized that we were low on naan bread and ran down to Kroger down the road to pick up extra. While he was out, rushing quickly to get back to church, a woman stopped him. Seeing his collar, she asked him if he would keep her son in his prayers. And he responded by saying yes, but then told her, "Why don't we pray now?" And thankful for his presence and idea, she accepted. Together, in the middle of the Kroger, they prayed for her son. I remember him sharing that in the midst of the business, to get back to church, he was stopped because the Spirit had other plans for him that day. Outside of this example, I have also witnessed other people in my life who have responded to the unexpected when the need arises, whether it is through words of affirmation, presence, or prayer in my own life or others. This Pentecost, we will hear about the Holy Spirit coming to the apostles and how it is a gift given to us in our own lives. And even though we cannot see with our human eye the Spirit, we can pay attention to the movement of the Spirit through the people and situations we encounter daily. I notice for myself the tug and nudge from the Spirit to respond in words and deeds with people that I meet along this holy journey. And those responses to those promptings included praying for people after hearing the weight they are carrying on their hearts. It is giving my lunch to the man at the train station who was in need of food. It is speaking up when I feel that people have been hurt, or groups need my voice of support. It is showing up to be there with someone, even if I don't exactly know what to say or do but trusting that the Spirit will guide me. And it is surprising to me at times, because in the midst of my to-do lists and going from point A to point B, the Spirit does poke me to stop, pay attention, and respond. And responding to the needs of others is what living out in Christ's love is all about. And the good news is that you, child of God, are given the gift of the Spirit in your own life and are equipped for such work in the world, through your own unique perspectives and gifts. There is an African American Spiritual called "I'm Goin' a Sing When the Spirit Says Sing," and in it, it states,

"I'm goin' a sing when the Spirit says sing...
I'm goin' a shout when the Spirit says shout...
I'm goin' a preach when the Spirit says preach...
I'm goin' a pray when the Spirit says pray...
And obey the Spirit of the Lord."



Being rooted in God's love and living in love, we are called to listen and pay attention to the needs of our neighbor, and trust that even if we are not sure what exactly to do, God will show up through the power of the Spirit and lead us on the way.

Crazy Faith Talk Asks End-Times Questions

Our weekly podcast, "Crazy Faith Talk," offers conversation and insights looking at a variety of topics, subjects, and ideas from faith and church life to pop culture and everything in between. Crazy Faith Talk releases new episodes every Tuesday at noon, and you can listen for free, either by finding the link on our Facebook page or even asking your Smart Speaker (like Amazon Echo) to play the podcast "Crazy Faith Talk." Crazy Faith Talk is now on Spotify! If you like to listen to music or podcasts using the Spotify app, you can find Crazy Faith Talk there! Crazy Faith Talk features our own Pastor Steve and Vicar Natalie, as well as Sarah Aasheim, an ELCA pastor serving in eastern Pennsylvania, and Erica Wellner, a Methodist pastor in western Pennsylvania. Think of it like being invited around the table to listen in to pastors talking through their own faith, questions, and struggles, and being able to take the conversation with you, listen, and reflect on wherever you go—in the car, from your smart-speaker, or on your phone or tablet.

This summer, these colleagues in ministry will be exploring how Lutheran Christians talk and think about *eschatology*, which is just the fancy theological term for "end times" or "last things." Every decade or so, there seems to be a new wave of fervor with people predicting (wrongly) that they know when Jesus will come again or looking to explain the day's headlines in light of their interpretation of the Book of Revelation. And when we hear voices like those, it can be very confusing to know what the Scriptures *actually* say, and why Lutheran Christians tend not to get carried away with convoluted timelines of end-times events. So, in this series, we'll explore where some of these ideas come from, what the Bible actually does—and doesn't—say about last things, and how we live as people of hope in Christ's coming in glory. We'll also explore where the notion of the "rapture" came from, since it's not actually in the Bible, and we'll trace the roots of this notion since it was invented in the 1800s. A JOURNEY WITH AMOS

Good Trouble: A Study in Amos (Thursdays at 1:00 p.m.)

In a time when people confused financial success with divine favor and focused on ritual rather than righteousness, God raised up a bold truth-teller and poet named Amos. And like all of the authentic prophets of ancient Israel, he was able to both comfort the afflicted... and to afflict the comfortable. Whether he was calling out the Respectable Religious Leaders of his day or pointing out how the most vulnerable of his society were being taken advantage of, Amos was willing to risk his reputation and his comfort in order to wake people up. He regularly got himself into what the late John Lewis used to call "good trouble." And his witness is an important one for us today, as people who promise every time, we affirm our baptism that we will "strive for justice and peace in all the earth." So, join us for an in-depth study of this prophet on Thursdays this summer as our next Thursday afternoon Bible study at 1:00 p.m., co-led by Pastor Steve and Vicar Natalie. We'll be starting up with this series on June 5, in the council room, and we'll be offering weekly video summaries as well to catch up if you can't join us in person around the table. We hope you'll be a part of this summer-long series here at Community of Christ studying Amos!

Big Things Coming up This June in Worship!

Coming up for the month of June, we've got several really special celebrations happening in worship, and we want you to join us for all of them at our 9:00 a.m. service!

June 1—Confirmation

Five of our young people have completed our two-year confirmation program (with a year focused on the Bible and a year in the Small Catechism) and will be confirmed on June 1. This milestone of faith is a time of *affirming their baptism*—to say "yes" back to the God who has already said "Yes!" to them first, and to choose to continue growing in their faith, discipleship, and service. June 8—Pentecost and New Members

We tell the story of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (sometimes also called the "birthday of the church") at Pentecost, and this year, we'll also welcome new members into the congregation!

"Into Your Hands"—An Encore Workshop on Christian Funerals and End-of-Life Questions

In early May, Visitation Ministry hosted a Saturday morning workshop co-led by Vicar Natalie and Pastor Steve on Christian funerals and questions that often arise in end-of-life situations. We had a very positive response to that event, and a number of people who were not able to attend because of timing asked if it could be shared again. So, this summer, we invite you to join us for an encore presentation of Into Your Hands, on the evening of Tuesday, July 22, from 6:00-8:00 p.m., covering the same content as the workshop we offered back in May. Sign up at the kiosk to join us for a chance to learn, discuss, and bring your questions. We'll also be able to share details about our usual practices for funeral services and meals here at Community of Christ, and we'll offer a chance for any who wants to think through their own wishes for service details to do so. Maybe this is a subject you've been putting off thinking about, or maybe you've just needed a reason to finally sit down with loved ones and talk through your wishes. But we hope that this workshop can be helpful for you, and we'd invite you to join us in June to find out more. Then, coming up in the fall, look for a new workshop that will look at another set of issues related to death and dying, focusing on documents like living wills, healthcare power of attorney, and estate planning, in case those topics are of interest to you, too. Visitation Ministry is grateful for the chance to get to present good information and workshops on topics that you find valuable, so please let us know if you have ideas for future topics that you would like covered in an educational format like this—see Cheryl Fischer or Cinda Pontsler.

Christian Group From Bethlehem (In the Holy Land!) Coming to Community of Christ

On June 22, 2025, during worship, we will be hosting a presenter from Holy Land Christian Solidarity Cooperative, a group based out of Bethlehem in the Holy Land, who will be making visits at several Lutheran congregations around Northwestern Ohio over the summer. In a Temple Talk during worship, we'll have a chance to hear about the present-day experience of Christians whose families have lived in the Holy Land for generations. After the 9:00 a.m. service, we will have a chance to peruse a display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem, available for purchase in the Gathering Space. HLCSC representative Dr. George Ghanem tells us, "These carvings include olive wood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels, and many other religious crafts that could make a nice wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter, and Christmas gifts. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread."

Dr. Ghanem also reports that "More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depends upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades, those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to recurring bouts of war, the 12-yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and right now the catastrophic ongoing war in Gaza for the past nineteen months. Because of all of these factors, tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land, which has made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland without their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century, today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and holy sites.

So, we invite you to learn more on June 22 and to consider helping to support our Christian brothers and sisters in the town of Bethlehem, where Christ was born, by purchasing their carvings, from which all proceeds will go to support Christian families from Bethlehem.

Let us carefully tend to our roots, Christian children of God in the Holy Land. And let us pray together for peace in the land where our Savior once walked to tell the world the good news of salvation.



This summer, as part of Vicar Natalie's internship project, we will be offering a weekly Summer Spiritual Practice group. The goal of this group is to learn a variety of ways to pray and draw close to God and to contribute to the NW Ohio Synod's theme of the Year of Listening. The spiritual practice group will meet on **Thursdays from 6:30-7:45 p.m.** in the fellowship hall starting **June 5th and ending August 28th** (no class July 3rd).
