August 2025—The Hand At Our Back



In our weekly summer Story Hour times on Tuesdays here at the church, we have a regular activity called "Mystery Bag," where one of the kids brings three items from home (often toys) and we pull them out of our mystery bag, so that, one by one, we can think and talk about how that object reminds us of God or connects to something in our faith. We've had action figures and toy animals, sunglasses and musical instruments... and a couple of toy bikes, too.

And recently, when a miniature two-wheeler (about the size of an action figure to ride) was pulled out of the bag, it brought to mind memories from the adults in the room of when we were the ones learning to ride a bicycle. Some remembered wistfully all their scraped knees and bumpy sidewalks from childhood streets. Others remembered wondering as young kids how a bicycle knows to stay upright when someone is pedaling. Some of the kids talked about their progress with training wheels and when they might be able to take them off of their bikes. And just about everyone had a memory of having a hand at our backs as we rode—a parent or grandparent who walked along right behind us as we pedaled. They kept up at our pace and did the difficult work of balancing how much to support and how much to let us find our own momentum. They were there to encourage and cheer, and they were there to pick us up when we crashed, so we could start all over again. And even decades later, we recall the presence of that loving hand at our back that helped to learn how to do something that seemed impossible before.

Whatever else it means to be disciples of Jesus, I think it means at least something like that. We are learning, as we follow Jesus, to do things we never thought possible before. We love in new ways, go to new places, find unexpected courage, meet new people, share our faith, serve our neighbors, and face new challenges. But we never do it alone. The Christian life isn't just about sitting still, leaving ourselves unchanged and unchallenged, but about that daring—even risky—move beyond our comfort zones. As scary as it can be to a kid taking off the training wheels for the first time, it can be scary to consider that Jesus is leading us to new places, meet new people, act in new ways, and try new means of serving and loving. We are creatures of comfort and routine quite often, and we can put up a lot of resistance to anybody—even Jesus—daring us to put our feet on the pedals. And yet, as anyone who has mastered bike riding can tell you, there is something amazing, freeing, and thrilling about that sensation of taking off on a bicycle, trusting the rules of physics to keep those two narrow wheels upright as you accelerate, and remembering the presence of the hand that quided you forward.

FROM PASTOR STEVE, CONTINUEd.....

In these weeks, our focus within our "Life on the Edge" year has been on "The Edge of Discipleship," and the realization that following Jesus will stretch us, challenge us, and push us into new directions. We will find ourselves trying new things (like our spiritual practice series on Thursdays), beginning new ministries (as our new Children, Youth and Family Ministry Facilitator brings fresh ideas and energy), walking down new streets in the city, or crossing the road to introduce yourself to a new neighbor—and maybe invite them to worship. Whatever that newness looks like, and whatever nervousness it brings along, remember what we first learned on the day the training wheels came off in childhood—there is always a hand at our back.

Let's go this August, together as disciples blazing new trails in this life on the edge.



Hard Sayings Of Jesus—Summer Sunday Adult Forum


Continuing this August, join us on Sunday mornings after worship for the summer edition of our Adult Sunday School class. We are gathering in the council room (also the Thursday afternoon Bible study room) at about 10:15 a.m. to look at some of the difficult sayings and actions of Jesus to explore what they mean (or what they don't mean) and to unpack some otherwise complicated and challenging teachings of Jesus. What did Jesus mean when he said, "It's easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom?" What about when Jesus said, "I have not come to bring peace, but a sword?" Why did Jesus overturn the moneychangers in the Temple? And what could be going on when Jesus told his disciples to leave behind parents, family, and children for the sake of following him? We'll be looking at a different passage and a different "hard saying" each week, so come when you can and join the conversation each Sunday this summer, here at Community of Christ!

Our weekly podcast, "Crazy Faith Talk," offers conversation and insights looking at a variety of topics, subjects, and ideas from faith and church life to pop culture and everything in between. Crazy Faith Talk releases new episodes every Tuesday at noon, and you can listen for free, either by finding the link on our Facebook page or even asking your Smart Speaker (like Amazon Echo) to play the podcast "Crazy Faith Talk." Crazy Faith Talk is now on Spotify! If you like to listen to music or podcasts using the Spotify app, you can find Crazy Faith Talk there! Crazy Faith Talk features our own Pastor Steve and Vicar Natalie, as well as Sarah Aasheim, an ELCA pastor serving in eastern Pennsylvania. Think of it like being invited around the table to listen in to pastors talking through their own faith, questions, and struggles, and being able to take the conversation with you, listen, and reflect on wherever you go—in the car, from your smart-speaker, or on your phone or tablet.

From the abundance of lemon balm growing in a garden to the clever protection mechanisms of a mother killdeer for the eggs in her nest to all sorts of other things in nature, we're training the eyes of our hearts to see the presence and design of God in the world around us. Thursdays at 1:00 p.m. in August: Rare Birds--Introducing Lesser-Known Prophets

You probably recognize the sound of a robin in your yard or the sight of a bright red cardinal at your feeder. Those birds are plentiful and familiar to many people in this part of the country. But every so often, you'll spot something you've never seen before or hear a peculiar birdsong and wonder what it came from--and who knows, maybe you've gotten to see a yellow warbler or an indigo bunting for the first time, or maybe a heron or an eagle! To be honest, there are times in our study of the Bible where it might feel like we are spotting rare birds like that, too. We probably have a decent familiarity with the Gospels, or with some of our favorite passages in Paul's letters or the psalms, and maybe a few favorite Old Testament stories from childhood Sunday School memories. But then there are those books whose names sound strange and unfamiliar, with names like "Obadiah" or "Habakkuk" that we don't remember reading before. Who are these people, and what did they have to say? What did their voice contribute among the more familiar sounds of robins and wrens like Isaiah or Moses? That's where we're headed in our next Thursday afternoon Bible study series, starting August 7th at 1:00 p.m. Our series on Amos that has run for most of the summer so far has now concluded, and we'll be taking one week off before our Thursday Afternoon Bible study will pick up on a new series, just for the month of August. This short fourpart series is a study of those "Rare Birds" from among the minor prophets--and we'll get a chance to survey several of them, find out what their message and ministry looked like in their own time, and then explore what they have to say to us in our own day, too. Everybody is welcome, and you don't need to bring anything but a Bible--meet us in the Bible Study/Council room starting on August 7 at 1:00 p.m.!



Attention Ladies! September is quickly approaching, so that means the Tuesday Ladies Bible study will be starting sooner than we think! The first day of class will start on September 9th @ 8:30 am. This fall, we will be reading "The Mothers & Daughters of the Bible Speak" by Shannon Bream. Please purchase the book and the workbook that goes with it as soon as possible. I am asking you to read the first chapter, "Jochebed and Miriam," and complete the first chapter in the workbook so that when we meet on the first day, we can dig into the study. The workbook is not difficult and will enhance our discussions. Also, Vicar Natalie will be joining us for some of the lessons and will lead the discussion. This is a change from what we have done in the past, but I think it will be a great change of pace for us. We would love you to be here on Sunday, August 10, to get to hear another up-and-coming voice of church leadership, both for Sunday worship and for the Adult Forum afterward.


Spiritual Practices

The goal of this group is to learn a variety of ways to pray and draw close to God and to contribute to the NW Ohio Synod's theme of the Year of Listening. The Spiritual Practice Group gathers on Thursdays from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Please continue to join us from now until Thursday, August 28th. 






















New Stickers from Social Action Support Salem

One of our ongoing mission partners in the Toledo area is Salem Lutheran Church, the oldest Lutheran congregation in Toledo and an ongoing presence for good in the Old North End neighborhood of Vistula. You may well have read about or participated in their weekly Tuesday night meals for the community, helped with Trunk or Treat in their parking lot, planted trees across the street, or participated in the Angel Tree gift giveaway for kids in the North End. You might have also seen or heard about their new monthly initiative called "Breakfast Church," where they offer a free breakfast as part of Sunday worship once a month. In other words, our friends at Salem are doing good work all the time to feed neighbors, invite them to worship in ways that nurture both body and spirit, and to care for their community. And we are blessed to get to connect with that good work where Christ is present at many points throughout the year.

So, here's one more way you can help support our mission partners at Salem in the various ways they work to feed neighbors around them and reflect God's goodness in their neighborhood. We have these new stickers that will be available starting August 3, and we'd invite you to take one for a suggested donation of \$5.00 each. We'll take all the proceeds and send them along to the food ministries at Salem. These stickers feature an original art design and the message, "Abundance is meant to be shared," which comes from the Gospel reading we'll hear in worship on Sunday, August 3, from Luke's Gospel (Luke 12:13-21). You can pick one up from the table in the Gathering Space, make a donation in the box on the table beside the stickers, and know that you are directly helping to feed neighbors, and to share the good things God has placed in our lives, which is exactly what those good things are meant for. We hope you'll boldly put one of these stickers on something you wear or carry around with you as a way to start a conversation, prompt a moment to share your faith with someone, or to remind you both of God's generosity and our call to share the abundance God puts in our lives.
