From Pastor Steve - With Jesus On the Margins

Here's a statement that will surprise absolutely nobody: there are no cool birds inside my house. Only four humans and one dog, but no interesting birds. They don't even come right up to my kitchen window or tap at the glass for me to watch when I'm doing the dishes after supper.

If I want to get to spot birds, I have to venture out of the house, through the sunroom, onto the back deck, into the yard, out into the neighborhood, or over to a Metro park. Once I get outside "my territory" and into the less familiar places further out from my home base, I see and hear all kinds of winged wonders. There's a hummingbird that has been drinking at the phlox in my back yard, and yellow warblers go dashing among the trees there, too. Or in the further reaches of the church yard, toward the prairie meadow, you can see swallows dive bombing and swooping like fighter jets on a training mission early in the morning, or if the conditions are right, you'll spot a turkey vulture or a hawk. And over at the river, if I am quiet, a heron just might emerge from the branches and float on big wide wings upstream. I've been noticing these days just how much unique beauty and unexpected difference are waiting to be seen, the further I get from the usual center places of my life. When I go to those spots on the margins—the edges of my yard, the wild corners of the church yard, or the untamed river—I discover wondrous things waiting to be encountered.

In this next phase of our year in discipleship, "Life on the Edge: Christianity Beyond Our Comfort Zones," our focus will be "With Jesus on the Margins," and I hope you'll hear that theme, not as something frightening, but rather as something full of beautiful possibilities. Like stepping outside the familiar bounds of my house to meet a hummingbird or a heron, Jesus is always going outside the bounds of polite company or closed social circles to meet people who have found themselves on the fringes. Sometimes they are on the margins because they are sick, and the wider society has pushed them out to contain the contagion. Sometimes they are outcasts because they are seen as sinners or sellouts—like Zacchaeus, the tax collector. Sometimes they are kept at arm's length because of their ethnicity, language, or way of dressing, like the Samaritan or the centurion whose paths cross with Jesus. Sometimes they are simply the folks who have been overlooked, left out, or left behind. But Jesus sees them all. He sees them, and rather than pitying or looking down on them, he names the beauty, the belovedness, and the infinite worth of every last one of them. Jesus doesn't go out to the edges of society holding his nose and scowling, like a roadside worker picking up litter; he goes out to the margins like he is ready to find herons, hawks, or hummingbirds. He goes to meet people where they are, to heal whatever places in them might be hurting, to restore anything in them that is lacking, and to declare that they are each beloved.

And of course, part of being disciples of Jesus is going where Jesus goes... among the people that Jesus meets... and to be prepared to be delighted and surprised. This month as we go *With Jesus on the Margins*, we'll be invited to go beyond our comfort zones to places off the beaten path of our daily routines, with folks who might be new faces, and to try new things that take us away from our homebase familiar places. We'll make sandwiches for *Food for Thought* to help engage neighbors on the streets of Toledo. We'll welcome new members into our church family. We'll hear from folks who are neighbors we might have overlooked, whether friends on the North End around Salem, Christians living and serving in Palestine and the Holy Land or caring for the needs of migrant workers in northwestern Ohio or school children near and far. But we don't go into those places to look down on anyone or pity them—we go as people seeking to meet neighbors, to follow Jesus, and to see signs of the wondrous diversity of God's creation. Who knows—we might even spot a heron along the way.

Join us this September as our year of discipleship take us *on the margins with Jesus*. We'll take these steps together.

Crazy Faith Talk Highlights "Profiles in Courage"







New for Fall Adult Forum: Who Is My Neighbor?

Our Adult Forum starts the fall season off with a new series we are calling, "Who Is My Neighbor?", which is inspired, as you can imagine, from the question in the gospel that prompts the story we call the Good Samaritan, where Jesus shows us that anyone God sends across our path is a neighbor, and therefore someone for us to love and be loved by. During the weeks of this series, starting September 14 during the 9:00 a.m. hour (between services) we will get the chance to hear from voices who can speak to the experience of neighbors near and far whose stories and needs might be quite similar to our own, or very different. We'll get to hear from folks like Pastor Mike Hanck about the community being built by the "Norf-End Neighbors" in the Vistula neighborhood of Toledo, Synod Staff member Calla Gilson who has spent time doing Young Adult Global Mission work in Israel and Palestine, and others who can share about different communities of neighbors around us in the world that God loves. Join us for these conversations throughout September and into October, beginning with our first Sunday back with two services, September 14!





This September, our Thursday Afternoon Bible Study begins a new series we're calling "Faithful Rebels" that will look at stories of holy troublemakers who went against the flow, spoke up against the powers of the day, or witnesses in countercultural ways in their own times and places. From the Hebrew midwives in Pharaoh's Egypt who saved the babies that the king ordered to be killed to prophets like Elijah challenging their own leaders, to the men in the fiery furnace refusing to bow down to a golden statue of an arrogant king, the Bible is full of stories in which God worked through people who bravely stood up against the expectations (or official decrees!) of the day as part of their way of living out their faith, caring for those in danger, or pointing to the presence of God in the world. If you have been looking for a good jumping-on point to join a Bible study, this is a great chance to join us! We'll gather around the table in the Bible study/council room on Thursdays at 1:00 p.m. starting on September 11, and we'll be sharing video summaries each week on the church Facebook page and on YouTube in case you can't be with us in person. Join us this fall to explore stories of devout defiance from faithful rebels!



Sunday School Year Kicks Off for Kids on September 14

We are excited for the return of a new Sunday School year for kids of all ages on Sundays, and we invite you to join us on Sundays in the 9:00 a.m. hour to learn about Jesus, explore stories from the Bible, and grow in faith together with friends! New Tote Bags from Social Action Support Salem

One of our ongoing mission partners in the Toledo area is Salem Lutheran Church, the oldest Lutheran congregation in Toledo and an ongoing presence for good in the Old North End neighborhood of Vistula. You may well have read or participated in their weekly Tuesday night meals for the community, helped with Trunk or Treat in their parking lot, planted trees across the street, or participated in the Angel Tree gift giveaway for kids in the North End. You might have also seen or heard about their new monthly initiative called "Breakfast Church," where they offer a free breakfast as part of Sunday worship once a month. In other words, our friends at Salem are doing good work all the time to feed neighbors, invite them to worship in ways that nurture both body and spirit, and care for their community. And we are blessed to get to connect with that good work where Christ is present at a number of points throughout the year.

We are continuing our partnership with Salem in a number of ways this fall, and one of them is to once again plant some additional fruit trees in the growing arboretum adjacent to the church, and we are inviting your support of the costs for those trees with a new tote bag that can be great for carrying groceries, wrapping gifts, or holding your personal items on a day's errands. These tote bags have the same design as the stickers we made available earlier this August, with the message, "Abundance is meant to be shared," echoing the Scriptural call to use our resources for the good of all, and Jesus' teaching that "To whom much is given, much is required" (Luke 12:48). You can still get stickers in the gathering space while supplies last, and you can get one or more of these tote bags on Sunday mornings at the table in the gathering space as well and know that you are directly helping to feed neighbors, to plant trees, and to share the good things God has placed in our lives—which is exactly what those good things are meant for. We hope you'll boldly put one of these stickers on something you carry around with you or use one of these tote bags as a way to start a conversation, prompt a moment to share your faith with someone, or to remind you both of God's generosity and our call to share the abundance God puts in our lives.

Your relationship with the giver is deepened, your joy is increased, and the same is probably true of the people around you whose lives are made better because you are using your gift well.

It's the same, really, in our relationships with God and with one another: when we use the gifts we have been given by God, our relationship with God is deepened, our joy is increased, and we make the world a better place for the people around us, too!
