Advent (December) 2025—Welcome to the Peaceable Kingdom

Imagine a little lamb reclining on a grassy field and leaning up against... a mama wolf. Imagine a fearsome lion, learning to eat grass beside the year's new calves. Imagine a heifer lovingly nuzzling... a bear cub.

It sounds like nonsense, doesn't it? It's too far-fetched—the stuff of fairy tales and children's stories, right? Natural enemies, at peace like that? Predators and prey, able to live together without anyone afraid of being eaten? It sounds downright impossible.

Except... that's exactly the kind of vision that the prophets give us as we hope for the new creation that the long-awaited Messiah, the Christ, will bring. God has been teaching us—in words we'll be hearing again this Advent—to dream bigger than we dared, to imagine a world where all are at peace, and no one is afraid, and to hope for God to make all things new. The Spirit has been inspiring us to believe that God can gather creatures as different as wolves and lambs and bring them into a new kind of community where all are safe, and no one has to be anyone else's lunch.

This Advent, as those powerful images from the Scriptures echo in our ears and hearts, I want to invite you to picture God doing that same kind of thing—even if in small ways and little glimpses—among us as God's people. As a new church year begins this month, we'll be starting a new theme for 2026, "Found Family: Claimed Together in Christ," that is all about God's way of gathering unlikely outsiders and beloved misfits into a new kind of family—one in which we have been found, and God promises we belong. Well, that's the peaceable kingdom of the prophets, too, isn't it? The only way lions and lambs, cows and wolves, could ever be at peace together is if God brings them all together and enables them to lie down in peace. And maybe that's what God is doing in this strange and beautiful motley crew we call the Church: bringing people from different backgrounds and perspectives, different stories and situations, into a new kind of family in Christ. In a time when the divisions and fault lines between people seem sharp and often insurmountable—red states and blue states, card-carrying "conservatives" and self-professed "progressives," small town and big city, and diverse faith traditions (not to mention UT versus BG, Lions versus Browns, or those who shout "Go Blue!" versus "Go Bucks!")—maybe it can feel like there's no way we could sit across the table from... **THEM** (whoever you picture as "them"), much less belong together. But if ours is the God who dares us to imagine a new creation where wolves and lambs recline together in peace, and where swords and other weapons are beaten into plows and other farming tools, then we can dare to believe this God can gather us together into a found family as well, despite all the ways that might seem impossible.

That's the invitation this Advent: to see how the same God who promises a new creation in the promised Messiah is making a new community among us, too. And if God can assemble the unlikely gathering of night-shift shepherds and traveling Magi alongside glorious angels and a weary couple looking for a place to deliver a baby, then God can gather us, too, into the found family of the body of Christ. Join us this season for the beginning of that adventure.

Weekly Thursday Bible Study Continues Sampling Wisdom Literature

Our weekly Thursday Afternoon Bible Study series continues on Thursdays this December (taking Christmas Day and New Year's Day off), as Pastor Steve and Vicar Natalie introduce us to the Wisdom Literature in the Bible. These are a set of writings in the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament that offer perspectives for daily living and the meaning of life, community, work, and goodness. They can be as short as a fortune-cookie fortune (like the Proverbs), as expansive as a philosophical treatise and memoir (like Ecclesiastes), as dramatic as the saga of Job, and as romantic as the poetry of Song of Songs. So, think of this series like a charcuterie board—a sampling of the different flavors and textures of all these kinds of wisdom literature in your Bible, which you might be led to study and read more in depth on your own. Join us on Thursdays at 1:00 p.m. in the Bible Study/Council room, with weekly video summaries up online on our church Facebook and YouTube as well. See you around the table!


Join us Wednesday Nights for Advent Midweek Worship with Holden Evening Prayer

We call Jesus the "Prince of Peace," and we sing that on the night of his birth "all is calm, all is bright." But quite often our lives are especially hectic and stressful in the weeks before Christmas, aren't they? From gift-buying and cookie baking to parties and concerts, from decorating our houses and family gatherings, we can feel flustered and frazzled during the "most wonderful time of the year" rather than at peace. So we want to invite you to a weekly chance to hit the pause button on the craziness and be re-centered on the Good News of God's coming to us in Christ, with our three Advent midweek services using Holden Evening Prayer. On Dec. 3, 10, and 17 (each are Wednesdays) at 7:00pm, join us for a beautiful and contemplative sung setting of Evening Prayer and reflections on the Word that will ground us in our hope for Jesus' coming. (Choir will rehearse following these services starting at 7:45pm on these evenings.) If you've never experienced this setting for evening worship, you'll definitely want to try it, and this is a fantastic event to invite friends and neighbors to, as well! Join us this Advent!

Blue Christmas Service Offers Comfort and Hope— Dec. 21 at 3:00 p.m.

The holidays can be a difficult time for people, especially if they're dealing with grief and loss. Whether still working through a recent death, feeling renewed sadness over a longtime loss, or just struggling while others seem full of Christmastime cheer, this can be a heavy season of the year. So, we'll continue a tradition we've done for the last several years here at Community of Christ by hosting a Blue Christmas service—a time of worship that offers comfort for those who need it. particularly at this time of year, and that connects our faith in God-with-Us who came among us in Bethlehem with our lived experience of loss and grief. This year's service will be held at 3:00 p.m. in the afternoon of Sunday, Dec. 21, with collaboration and shared leadership from our friends at Hope United Methodist Church as well. As always, it is open to any and all who would find it helpful. You are welcome to invite friends, relatives. neighbors, or community members who might need a moment this season for grief to be named and comfort to be given, together with folks from around our community.

Introducing "Found Family" Our Theme for Discipleship in 2026!



There are people in your life who become your support and your safety net, even if you don't share biological or familial connections with them. Sometimes that community of people can be especially important for those who do not have a supportive family at home or are estranged from their loved ones. People sometimes talk about this new circle of love as a "found family" or a "chosen family." And in many ways, it is a compelling picture of the kind of community we are called to be as the church. We are more than a social club or collection of isolated individuals, but we are not defined by biology, ethnicity, language, or culture—we are brought into a community as authentic and dependable as family, but we have been found by Christ and gathered into it by grace, rather than by DNA.

That's the vision for our theme in 2026, which will guide preaching and teaching, shape worship, and offer direction for devotional and spiritual formation resources throughout the year ahead. We hope to focus on this coming year, starting with Advent 2025 and throughout 2026, on how God's love in Christ has gathered us into a *found family*, and how it is God's grace that has found us and made us to belong in Christ. That's the heart of the Gospel's Good News: God has found us by grace, claimed us together in Christ, and brought us into a new kind of community, not on the basis of our sameness in demographics or likemindedness or backgrounds, but simply because God says we belong in the family. That is good news worth being reminded of, and it is worth sharing with others, too!

You'll see that focus on Sunday mornings, in Pastor Steve's daily devotions online (at beinggraced.blogspot.com), in visual arts throughout the year, and in other opportunities to learn and grow together. This coming year, our Sunday Scripture readings from the Revised Common Lectionary will be primarily rooted in Matthew's Gospel, which has a special focus on community and how we live together as "found family" in the church. We hope this time together in the Word will help deepen our connections to one another as a "found family" called Community of Christ, especially in times that can feel fragmented and harried, and that we'll be strengthened in our relationships with God and with one another through this focus.

To get things started, we have a couple of free gifts for anyone who wants one. You can get a 3-inch sticker or a 2-inch square magnet with the new original logo and the tagline "Found by Grace" in the Gathering Space. They're free and just a way of remembering that good news for this year ahead together. Stay tuned for more ways to see our Found Family theme in the year ahead, and keep your eyes, ears, and hearts open for more reminders that we have been found by grace, claimed together in Christ, and brought in the family of God!

Keep Your Eyes Open for Advent Visuals

The weeks before Christmas are a part of a season we call *Advent*, in which we are called to keep watch and keep awake for the coming of Christ. To help us practice that spiritual watchfulness and open-eyed preparation, we have several things to look out for this year, both in our worship space and around the building. See if you can find them all:

- New Advent and Christmas banners (in the sanctuary)—These four banners were painted by members of Community of Christ in November and feature the figures of the Nativity and Epiphany stories all being drawn together at the center, where Christ will be born. See if you can spot three sheep along with the shepherds, following the direction of the angels, or the gifts of the Magi following the star toward Mary and Joseph.
- Bethlehem Village (in the Gathering Space)—We created this visual display last year, and it's back by popular demand: see in the Gathering Space a 3-foot by 4-foot model of Bethlehem, including fields outside the town where shepherds are keeping their flocks, and lit houses and buildings where families live and Roman soldiers march through the streets. See if you can spot where Mary and Joseph are seeking to find a place for their baby to be born!
- Peaceable Kingdom (in the display case in the Gathering Space)—This year's Sunday Scripture readings in Advent will feature the theme of God's coming "peaceable kingdom." In one particular passage from Isaiah, the prophet envisions animals that had been natural enemies now living in peace and safety—the wolf and the lamb, the lion and the calf, and others, all led by a child. It seems almost too wonderful to imagine, but that's the vision of God's new creation for which we are hoping in Christ. So, in the glass display cabinet in the front of our Gathering Space, look for a scene imagining that peaceable kingdom and let it spark your own faithful imagination and hope for God's reign of peace!
- Pastor Steve's Misfit Nativity (also in the glass display case)—Earlier this past year, Pastor Steve shared the unique Nativity scene he has gathered together over the years with mismatched pieces, repurposed figures, and unlikely elements. They don't look like they fit together, except that they belong because they have been claimed to belong. In a way, that's what our theme of "Found Family" is all about: being the people who sometimes feel like misfits or outsiders, but who have been gathered in by God. We don't all match and we don't all look alike, but Christ brings us together. See if you can spot the Misfit Nativity in the Gathering space, too, and know that there is a place for you there, too!





"Prayers for the Peaceable Kingdom"-Collected Prayers for Advent

For the past several years in Advent, we have offered an anthology of daily Scripture readings and original prayers for the season that dovetailed with the Scripture readings we are using in Sunday worship (which are also keyed into the Revised Common Lectionary). In 2023, that collection was called "Astonish Us Again," and last year's collection, "On the Edge of Hope," was also available. Because these have been wellreceived, this year, we are pleased to offer a new compilation that will connect with our new theme for the year that begins with this Advent (November 30). Prayers for the Peaceable Kingdom is a new collection of original prayers and Scripture readings for each day in Advent, drawing especially on readings from the Bible we'll hear this Advent on God's coming reign of peace in which "swords are beaten into plowshares" and "the wolf and the lamb lie down together." This collection is available to you this year either as a printed booklet (in the Gathering Space), as a PDF compilation you can read on your phone, computer, or tablet, or as daily posts on our church Facebook page. These are free, original, and can be shared as far and wide as you would like. Check them out this Advent, as together we pray in hope for the peaceable kingdom of Jesus, our Lord!
