Called by Christ—January (The Season of Epiphany) 2026

When I stop and think about it, it amazes me the lengths God will go to in order to get through to us.

There are already thousands of stars visible in the night sky, those dazzling points of light in the heavens that "declare the glory of God," as the Psalmist puts it. To look out at the night sky and see even the tiny fraction of stars that are visible to our naked eyes should point us to God. And as if that weren't enough, God puts a light in the sky that gets the attention of some eastern sky-watching astrologers (whom we call the Magi, or the Wise Men), using a means that they would understand and recognize, in order to bring them to meet the Christ-child, and to be forever changed by the encounter.

There had been plenty of prophets and visionaries raised up by God to speak a message to the people before, too. In the first century, the words of prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah, Micah, and Amos had not only been spoken before, but were written down with copies being read in synagogues all over Galilee and Judea. And as if that weren't enough, God raises up John the Baptizer to call attention to Jesus of Nazareth... **and** sends the Holy Spirit to alight on Jesus like a dove... **and** speaks from heaven, "This is my Son!" all to get the listening and watching crowds to know that God was communicating in a whole new way.

For that matter, plenty of other rabbis had come and gathered plenty of their own students before to learn their own nuanced interpretations of the Torah. And yet along the shore comes Jesus, who doesn't hold auditions or tryouts to winnow the candidates down to the best of the best, but seeks a bunch of unschooled fishermen and calls them to follow him, just as they are, meeting them where they are.

Just look at the lengths God will go to in order to get through to us.

In these days, as we celebrate the season of Epiphany (the "revealing" or "manifestation" of Jesus to the world), God is at it again: reaching through time and space, through ancient story and song, by the same Spirit that descended on Jesus, to call us and draw us to Christ. We don't just read the old words as a record of what God *used* to do—we discover that God is still drawing us, pulling us, leading us by the hand, to bring us into a deeper relationship with Jesus and to follow in his way. And for all the times in our lives where we have turned away, gotten distracted, looked at our phones instead, or put our trust in something else, God has not given up on us. God continues to go to great lengths to get through to us.

Join us on Sundays where Christ comes among us in water and Word, in bread and in wine. Join us around the Bible study table where God keeps speaking through ancient scriptures. Join us in visits to the homebound, meals for those recovering from sickness or surgery, conversation around good food, and all sorts of other ways. Together we'll be surprised all over again at what means God uses to reach us, and to call us closer to Christ. Let's find out what's next.

GROWING IN GOD'S WORD

Thursday Bible Study Resumes January 8 With A New Series

Every year on Christmas Eve here at Community of Christ, as we light our candles, we hear the opening passage of John's Gospel and its well-known opening: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God..." This opening section of John's Gospel is unique—it feels less like a biography (which the rest of the Gospel feels like) and more like a poem or a hymn. It zooms out from the particular details of first-century Palestine to the creation of the entire universe, before bringing us right back to the nitty-gritty of life under the Roman Empire and the dusty roads of Judea. Within the Scriptures, this section, often called the *Prologue* of John's Gospel, is one of a kind. And yet, we rarely take the time for a deep dive to delve into the theology, imagery, and biblical connections that are all waiting to be explored there, especially in the rush of the days around Christmas.

So... let's try something different. Once the loaded schedules and overstuffed Christmas celebrations have come and gone for another year, and once the lights and the tree are down (at least at the church), you are invited to a four-part study on Thursdays, beginning on January 8, on the Prologue of John's Gospel. What do these powerful, familiar, mysterious words mean? What do they say about Jesus, and why does it matter? What difference do they make in our lives? And what Good News have we maybe been missing out on by only reading through them at a surface level? Join us around the Bible study table for this study in the new year, beginning at 1:00 p.m. on January 8th, 2026!

Save the Date: Feb. 22 for Vicar Natalie's Farewell



If you prefer to make a donation to the Flower Fund instead, you can use the envelope marked "donations only." We are grateful for your continued support and blessings! Thank you!


We Welcome Volunteers of All Ages!


