Being Easter People—April (Easter) 2026

Our journey through Lent culminates in the drama, beauty, and passion of the Great Three Days within Holy Week, and you're invited to gather with us in worship for these special events and services this Holy Week.

Palm Sunday (8:00am and 10:00am)—March 29

The story of Jesus' triumphal entry and revolutionary upside-down parade into Jerusalem begins Holy Week on Palm Sunday, and you'll be invited into the story yourself with palm branches and celebration at our usual two service times on March 29.

Maundy Thursday—Footwashing Forgiveness, and Holy Communion—April 2, 7:00pm

On the night of Jesus' betrayal, John's Gospel tells us that he washed the feet of his disciples (including Judas!) and commissioned his followers to love one another with the same self-giving love that serves even in lowly positions. We are also told that on that same night, Jesus took the remaining bread and cup of the Passover meal and re-imagined it as the meal of his own body and blood that we call Holy Communion, or the Lord's Supper. All of these moments point ahead to Jesus' act of self-giving love at the cross, and we are drawn into the story of it all on Maundy Thursday, as our worship includes the practice of foot or handwashing, the declaration of forgiveness, and the celebration of Holy Communion. Join us for this powerful night that begins the great Three Days (or Triduum) of the Holy Week story!

Good Friday—The Passion According to Saint John—April 3, 12:00pm and 7:00pm

We gather in worship to remember the story of Jesus' suffering and death, guided by the storytelling of John's Gospel, on Good Friday. Join us for a powerful service that brings each of us to the foot of the cross to witness and worship the Crucified One, at both 12:00 noon and 7:00pm.

Holy Saturday—Easter Vigil—April 4, 7:00pm at Community of Christ

This is a new tradition for us at Community of Christ, but its roots are ancient and go back to the early centuries of Christian worship. On the night before Easter, we gather to retell the ancient stories of our faith, to kindle a new fire by which to light the Paschal Candle, to remember our baptism and renew our affirmation of living as the baptized followers of Jesus, and then to hear the first news of the resurrection! Our version of the Easter Vigil will be modified to be friendlier for families and children, too, and will involve participation from our youth and confirmation students as well. Even though some versions of the Vigil of Easter begin in the middle of the night and last until dawn, ours will start at 7:00pm, beginning with the kindling of a fire outside and then leading inside where the art projects we've been making throughout Lent will be brought together as part of the Great Story of God, and we'll see our worship space transformed for the


celebration of the resurrection of Jesus! And instead of lasting all through the hours of the night, this service will run about an hour and a quarter—still giving a chance to experience the power of the move from death to resurrection but also letting families with younger children still participating. We hope you'll join us for this special event that is unlike any other service in the church's year!

Easter Sunday—The Resurrection of Our Lord, 8:00am and 10:00am

Join us for the all-out celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, on Easter Sunday at both our 8:00am and 10:00am services, with our kids' Easter Egg Hunt in between at 9:00am! This year, we are also excited to celebrate a baptism at our 8:00am service on Easter Sunday!


On Crazy Faith Talk Podcast: Why Does End-Times Theology Matter?

Our weekly podcast, “*Crazy Faith Talk*,” offers conversation and insights looking at a variety of topics, subjects, and ideas from faith and church life to pop culture and everything in between. *Crazy Faith Talk* releases new episodes every Tuesday at noon, and you can listen for free, either finding the link on our Facebook page, or

even asking your Smart Speaker (like Amazon Echo) to play the podcast “Crazy Faith Talk.” **Crazy Faith Talk is now on Spotify!** If you like to listen to music or podcasts using the Spotify app, you can find Crazy Faith Talk there! *Crazy Faith Talk* features our own Pastor Steve, and two other colleagues in ministry: Sarah Aasheim, an ELCA pastor serving in eastern Pennsylvania and Methodist colleague Erica Wellner, who is serving in central Pennsylvania. And even though her time with us as an intern and vicar is complete, we are excited to share that **Natalie Downs** will be continuing presently on the podcast as a voice around the conversation, too! So even though we won't see her on Sunday mornings any longer, we can still hear her voice in the mix as we explore topics of all sorts with each week's episode. Think of it like being invited around the table to listen in to pastors talking through their own faith, questions, and struggles and being able to take the conversation with you listen and reflect on wherever you go—in the car, from your smart-speaker, or on your phone or tablet.

In the weeks after Easter, we're beginning a new series that will explore how we think about the “end times” and why it makes a difference in our very real present-day lives. Since notions of a secret “rapture” of believers are only about 200 years old, what does a more authentically *biblical* understanding of Jesus' coming in glory look like? We'll explore questions that are very much relevant to our day and time like, “Is there anything we can do to either hurry along Jesus' coming or delay it through our actions?” and “Does Jesus need human assistance to defeat the powers of evil in some kind of cosmic battle?” And we'll even take a closer look at phrases and ideas from the book of Revelation and other passages that many folks assume they know the meaning of, like “Armageddon” or “antichrist,” only to discover that the New Testament means something different than what pop culture has taught us. This series should be helpful for folks who have ever wondered, “What do we really think about Jesus' coming again—and should I be afraid, or hopeful about it?” There's something for everyone, so listen in and check out this series with our weekly posts on our church Facebook page or Twitter/X (@BeingGraced), by searching for “Crazy Faith Talk” on Spotify, or on your smart speaker!

Adult Forum Explores Luther's Small Catechism, Sundays at 9:00am

Whether you first learned these things long ago in a confirmation class or you have never had a chance to study the catechism, this is a great chance to explore some of the Big Ideas of the Christian faith and get at why it all matters, and what it all means. Join us between services continuing this spring in the Bible study/council room!

Join us for our current series in our Thursday afternoon Bible Study, as we take a deep dive into the New Testament book of Acts to learn the story of the early church and how the band of rag-tag fishermen and tax collectors from Galilee grew into a movement that reached outward to the very heart of the Roman Empire and became a "found family" of Jewish and Gentile people, rich and poor, enslaved and free, women and men, and lived through the growing pains of that outreach to change the world. Join us weekly on Thursdays at 1:00pm in the Bible Study/Council Room as we work through the book of Acts and let it spark our own ways of living out our faith and sharing the good news of Jesus in the world around us.

Journey to the Cross and the Table

What does it mean to walk with Jesus to the cross and to gather at the table he set for his disciples?

Over the past couple of months, our youth have been exploring two Sunday night series: The Journey to the Cross and Holy Communion. Together we worked through the Lenten Gospel readings, reflecting on what Jesus was teaching the people he encountered and the disciples who followed him.

From there, we turned to the story of the Last Supper. On the night before his crucifixion, Jesus gathered with his disciples, broke bread, and shared the cup. In that simple act, he gave the church a practice that Christians have continued for generations: gathering together to remember him.

We also talked about how different Christian traditions understand Communion. While churches describe the mystery of the bread and cup in different ways, we share the belief that Christ meets us at the table and invites us into a community shaped by grace, love, and service.

We will conclude the series by sharing a meal together, reminding us that faith is not only something we learn about, but it is something we practice together.

As we move forward from Lent, we invite you to join us as Easter people, exploring how the empty tomb continues to shape our lives today.
